

Miracle needed to end drought

The current rainfall across much of mainland Portugal. which is due to stop from Sunday, will not be sufficient to end the current drought, Portugal's Environment Minister has warned. This was followed by the chairman of the Portuguese Met Office, saying that a "November miracle" was required to end the drought.

hile substantial rain has fallen, especially across fire-ravaged central and northern Portugal, these showers will not compensate the chronic lack of

The President of the Portuguese Met Office (IMPA) Miguel Miranda, said this week that the "November miracle we need is for a steady drizzle to fall during a very long time". But with more than 80 percent of the country in a state of severe drought, the weather chief said that current models forecast below average rainfall in the mid-term.

The Bishop of Lisbon, perhaps following on the calls for a miracle, this week issued a statement calling for prayer, with Dom Clemente calling on priests to pray for "the necessary rainfall" during Mass. While the country waits for a "miracle" to break the drought, the government has in the meantime called on Portuguese to be much more sparing in their use of water and has told local authorities to limit the water they use to clean and irrigate towns and cities. Portugal's Environment Minister, João Matos Fernandes, in announcing

the measures said "no-one must be mistaken" about the seriousness of the drought that is affecting the country. He said two or three days' rain will not change the situation, adding that a campaign is to be launched to encourage the careful use of water by everyone.

The Government praised independent initiatives being taken by Town Halls, singling out the case in Nelas, where the council decreed the closure of municipal swimming pools until water levels had returned to satisfactory levels. The Environment Minister forecast that he expected other Town Halls to follow suit, especially with the expected deterioration of

the drought. João Matos Fernandes added the sole priority of the Government is to ensure sufficient water for human consumption. The latest monthly weather bulletin issued by the IPMA however paints a bleak picture of the current state of the climate in Portugal. IPMA chief Miguel Miranda says he is unable to find examples where Portugal has seen the state of a drought deteriorate during the month of October. He said that the rainfall

recorded last month was 50 percent below existing averages, and in many cases, only 20 percent of average rainfall for October was registered.

The Met Office also revealed that yet another weather record was broken in October, being the hottest since 1931, when weather details were first logged.

The average temperature was said to be 3 degrees Celsius above normal, while average maximum temperatures soared to 5 degrees above the median. The IPMA also said there were two heat waves between 1 and 16 and between 23 and 30 October in most of the country except the coastal areas. This comes after September was found to be the driest month ever in Portugal.

The six-month period from April to September was also said to be the second driest since records began, while the average maximum temperatures for this period were also the highest meteorologists had ever seen in Portugal. Average temperatures across the mainland were meanwhile the second highest they had ever been. Back in May, a British study predicted that Portugal

could be subject to "megadroughts" lasting for many years. According to climate models drawn up by researchers at Newcastle University in the study, entitled 'Assessing the threat of future megadrought in Iberia', the area could see a 15-year period of rainfall at less than half the average level. Researchers selected a total of 15 different climate models used by leading scientific bodies around the world, including Nasa, the UK Met Office and the

Max Planck Institute for Meteorology. Writing in the International Journal of Climatology, they said: "All models project an intensification of drought conditions for the Douro, Tagus and Guadiana. However they strongly disagree on the magnitude of these changes.

Some project small increases in drought conditions but most project multi-year droughts reaching up to (...) eight years of mean annual rainfall

Autumn makes its presence felt

Last weekend may have been the last really summery weekend for Portugal until next year, as this weekend - and the coming week - are looking wet, cloudy and cool.

Lisbon: Showers, at times heavy, on Friday and Saturday will clear up by Sunday and the start of the new week will at least be bright and sunny. It will also be noticeably colder, with thermometers set to plunge to highs of around 17 degrees Celsius

South: A similar conjecture to that of Lisbon is forecast for the Algarve, where a mix of rain, cloud and sun will be in place on Saturday, before clearing up for sunny skies by Sunday. Temperatures there will be a few degrees warmer than Lisbon, with highs settling around the 20 degrees mark.

North: Northern Portugal will be wetter but not much cooler than the rest of the country. Rain is forecast to fall over much of the weekend and coming week, although those showers will at times be light, with some sun coming through, and temperatures in the mid-to-high teens.

According to a 424-page study published earlier this year by the European Environment Agency (EEA), titled 'Climate change, impacts and vulnerability in Europe 2016', cashstrapped Portugal has

suffered monetary losses of 6.8 billion euros as a result of climate change between 1980 and 2013. Southern and south-east-ern Europe is forecast to be a climate change hotspot, as it is expected to face the highest number of adverse impacts, the EEA report reveals.

"This region is already experiencing large increases in heat extremes and decreases in precipitation and river flows, which have heightened the risk of more severe droughts, lower crop yields, biodiversity loss and forest fires", researchers found, warning further that more

frequent heatwaves and changes in the distribution of climate-sensitive infectious diseases are expected to increase risks to human health and well-being. Average temperatures in Portugal have in the last 40 years increased at a rate of 0.5 degrees per decade twice as fast as globally.



MPs debate Budget

MPs this week gathered in Parliament to debate the State Budget for 2018. Among major alterations for the coming year are an increase in the number of income tax brackets, higher pensions and a return to automatic promotions in the civil service. The changes to income tax are expected to positively affect the finances of 1.6 million families, while 400,000 civil servants are set for promotion and resulting wage increases in 2018. MPs will have until 17 November to present changes to the budget proposal before voting takes place on 27 November.

Portugal fares poorly for bullying


Portugal has outranked the United States in terms of the number of cases of bullying reported by children. According to a new report compiled by children's organisation UNICEF, Portugal ranks 15th for the number of bullying cases reported in Europe and North America. The report, entitled: "A Familiar Face: Violence against children and adolescents" found that between 31 and 40 percent of Portuguese children aged between 11 and 15 had been the victims of bullying in the two months immediately preceding the study.

Companies with more than 100 workers to justify wages

Companies with more than 100 workers are to be required to justify wage discrepancies among workers. The new rule, part of new legislation to promote equality, will see companies being asked by labour inspectors to justify pay differences for workers performing similar tasks. In the event of being unable to offer a satisfactory justification, bosses will be required to increase the wages of lower income workers in the space of two years.

Tourists spend record amounts

Foreign tourists visiting Portugal during the summer have broken all spending records. Numbers released by the Bank of Portugal, show that payments and cash withdrawals done with the use of foreign issued bank cards totalled just under 1.6 billion euros between the beginning of July and the end of September. The central bank spending by foreign tourists has been rising strongly since 2015. The United Kingdom led the total purchases with 348 million euros, following closely by France, with 339 million euros.

The historical leader of failed bank BES, Ricardo Salgado, denied on Tuesday any mismanagement at the bank and said he felt no blame for the situation of the victims, adding that the court could decide who was liable in the case.

Ricardo Salgado said the resolution of BES "was a disaster", an opinion he believes is now shared by "many people", since there were provisions that were transferred to Novo Banco and that were then not used to solve the commitments towards the victims'

and offenders

from sky

A C-295M plane belonging to the Portuguese Air Force spent this past weekend circling Portugal's skies, scouring the country from high above to detect fires and people.

The plane carried out several missions in several parts of the country and alerted fire-brigades whenever irregularities were detected.

This past weekend the Air Force spotted a number of fires that were just starting up, hence helping firefighters respond to them before they flared out of control.

During the 48 hours the specialist aircraft, belonging to 502 Squadron and based in Montijo, was used for monitoring purposes, it also detected people using fire to clear land, as well as other behaviours that were deemed as being risky, given the high temperatures still afflicting Portugal.

News in Brief

More than €8bn transferred out of Portugal in 2016

An estimated 8.6 billion euros were transferred to offshore accounts out of Portugal in 2016 alone. These figures are based on numbers issued by the national Tax Authority released on Monday evening. Officials said they traced these amounts to a total of just under 59,000 transfers which banks reported to the taxman. This figure is slightly down on 2015, when Portuguese sent a total of 8.8 billion euros to offshore tax havens.

Two tons of donated goods collected in Faro for fire victims

Two tons of second-hand donated goods have been collected in Faro for the victims of the recent wild fires in northern and central Portugal. The donated items were distributed this week in Tábua, Arganil, and Paradela da Cortiça. Launched by a group of youngsters with the support of Faro council, the ten-day campaign gathered a ton of clothes, 800 kilos of foodstuff, 300 kilos of which was for animals, various types of medication, 108 mattresses, 50 televisions, and a range of white goods and furniture.

Motocross World Championship returning to Portugal

The Motocross World Championship will be returning to the 'International Crossdromo' in Águeda, in northern Portugal, on 14 and 15 April next year. This was confirmed by the event organiser Youthstream, and the Agueda Action Club today. Club chairman, Albano Melo, said they had invested heavily for the championship to return to Portugal and they were working to make the world-class event even better. The Águeda race will be the fifth in the championship.

Nurses demand probe into SNS waitinglist deaths

Portugal's national nurses association has asked the Public Prosecutor to investigate the cases of 2,605 people who died while waiting for an operation on the SNS National Health Service's waiting list. The head of the association, Ana Rita Cavaco, said she believes it is important the prosecutor ascertains whether or not there is criminal liability involved. A letter with the request was also sent to Portugal's President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa and to Parliament.

Prosecutors investigate child abuse at Faro crèche

Prosecutors have confirmed that they are investigating allegations of child abuse at a Faro children's centre. The alleged physical abuse of babies is said to have occurred at the O Despertar crèche. The venue forms part of the Algarve Diocese and has led officials to suspend two female workers at the crèche after details of abuse were revealed. The centre has a capacity for 152 children, ranging from three months to five years old.

TAP launches London City route

National airline TAP has launched a new route to London City airport. The new route will see the national flag carrier fly twice a day to the central London airport. This brings the number of destinations the airline travels to in the British capital up to three, alongside Gatwick and Heathrow. TAP said in a statement that air traffic between Lisbon and London has shown strong growth in 2017, with passenger numbers up 28 percent. Estimates are that 700,000 passengers will fly on TAP between the two cities during the course of this year.

England rugby returns to the Algarve

The England rugby squad have returned to the Algarve as they prepare for the traditional autumn internationals that will be staged next month. As has become customary in recent years, the world's second best team has been preparing at Browns Sports Leisure Club Vilamoura for some training in the Algarve sunshine. The Six Nations champions touched down on Sunday afternoon with 32 players called up by coach Eddie Jones to prepare for three test matches at Twickenham against Argentina, Australia and Samoa.

Property prices in Portugal rocketing

Property prices in Portugal are soaring with the average price for a square metre of property currently standing at €896. However there are 41 municipalities where prices are above that average.

he pick-up of Portugal's property market in recent times has been widely re ported, and is showing no signs of slowing down.

A square metre of real estate in Lisbon is currently 15 percent more expensive than it was this time last year, at €2,231 per square metre of floor space, and the capital is the most expensive municipality in the country, when it comes to buying a new house.

Interestingly, in some areas, an old property now costs as much as a new build.

Nationally, the top three most expensive regions are Lisbon, Porto

and the Algarve. The cheapest places to buy a house in Portugal are the Beiras and Serra da Estrela (central Portugal).

This is according to an in-depth report by newspaper *Correio da Manhã*, based on new figures from the National Statistics Institute (INE).

These figures show that the current average price for a square metre of real estate in Portugal (€896) is up 6.4 percent on figures this time last year, and the difference in the cost of floor space between the most expensive neighbourhood and the cheapest is over €2,000.

Portugal's most expensive neigh-

bourhood is, perhaps unsurprisingly, the heart of Lisbon, where buying a house along the Avenida da Liberdade or Marquês de Pombal costs around €3,294 per square metre; up 46.1 percent in 12 months.

Cascais, and Loulé and Lagos (in the Algarve) all have prices that are above €1,500 per square metre.

Practically the whole of the Algarve has prices that range between averages of €896 and €2,231 per square metre, hence making it one of the top-three most expensive districts in the country, with only the municipalities of Monchique and Alcoutim being below that benchmark.



News in Brief

French Cinema Festival returning to Faro

The French Cinema Festival returns to Faro next week, between 7 and 10 November (Tuesday to Friday). It will be staged at the Figuras Theatre and aims to showcase the best of French movies, from old classics to new releases. The initiative was launched 18 years ago and travels 11 cities in Portugal, including Faro.

Starry skies to be active next month

The coming month of November will bring with it three major meteorite showers, which, cloud permitting, should be visible from Portugal. Venus will also be visible throughout the whole of the coming month as a morning star. The first star shower will be from 4-5 November, followed by another one on 11-12 November, and last on November 17 or 18.

Fake notes circulating in Portugal on the rise

The number of fake notes circulating in Portugal is also on the rise. The most common fake note is the €20, with lots of them being brought in from France and Italy. The number of forged notes taken out of circulation in Portugal this year has doubled, with over 8,000 notes being removed during the first half of this year.

Solverde Poker Season gets underway from Friday

Starting this Friday, the Solverde Poker Season gets underway in Portugal, with the event's main Algarve hub being Vilamoura casino. The Algarve heat is staged in Vilamoura between Friday and Sunday, with a €40,000 prize on the table. The winner will also secure a place in the final, at the Espinho Casino in December.

Tavria's Pego do Inferno attraction to undergo overhaul

Work is to be carried out at the Pego do Inferno natural attraction in the Eastern Algarve after it was damaged by fire in 2012. The popular waterfall and natural pool has been officially closed to the public since 2012 despite countless visitors flocking to the spot each year. Tavira council is hoping to breathe new life into the area while upgrading its natural beauty and making it safer.

Four-year-old boy is Easyjet's 15 millionth passenger from Faro

A four-year-old boy has become the 15 millionth passenger to travel with British airline Easyjet from Faro. The youngster, whose mother is French and father is Spanish had been on holiday with his parents in Olhão and was returning to Lyon. He was received with orange juice and cupcakes to celebrate the occasion before boarding his flight. The occasion also marked Easyjet's 18th anniversary of flights to and from Faro.

Coca-Cola to slash sugar content in Portugal

The Coca-Cola group has said its most popular and sugary drinks on sale in Portugal and Spain will have their sugar levels slashed by 12 percent over the next three years to adapt to new needs and lifestyles.

his comes after a new tax was introduced in Portugal in February to drive a change to eating and drinking habits.

Coca-Cola, Fanta, Nordic Tonic and Aquarius will all be made less sugary and less calorific, Tiago Lima, head of the Coca-Cola group's external relations for Portugal, told newspaper Diário de Notícias (DN). "In addition to continuing to reduce the sugar content in beverages, we aim to reduce the level of sugar in our beverages by 12 percent by 2020, along with the introduction of new sugar-free drinks or an expansion of those that are already sugarfree", he explained.

This is part of the multinational's new strategy for Iberia, in which "we have a duty and concern to meet consumers' tastes and needs by offering more beverage options, reducing sugar content, launching no-sugar or no-added sugar options, providing clear information, and having smaller packages",

Lima stressed.

Of the 100 products currently sold by the Coca-Cola group, 28 have no added sugar.

Earlier this year a tax on alcohol and alcoholic beverages was extended to sugary drinks.

Last month, Portugal's Health Minister highlighted the success of the levy on sugary drinks, saying Portuguese will this year have consumed over 4.2 fewer tons of sugar than last vear.

Minister, Adalberto Campos Fernandes, also said thanks to the tax, which was introduced in February, companies have made concerted efforts to supply healthier alternatives.

However, in comments to DN, Tiago Lima denied the group's sugar reduction was in direct response to the tax, stressing the market-leading multinational altered its company policies in 2000.

'This is a new phase in a sugarreduction strategy that we have been developing over the last decade, with the main objective being to respond to consumer needs and consumption trends", he clarified.

Sugar-free drinks represented 21 percent of Coca-Cola group's sales in September, and, Tiago Lima said, the consumption of full-sugar drinks has dropped over the last year.

Portugal currently has one of the highest child obesity rates in Europe, being among the top-five EU countries in terms of overweight teens.

One third of Portuguese children are estimated to be overweight, and, Alexandra Bento, head of the country's nutritionists association. said this is largely due to mistakes being made by families in their eating habits and a general lack of exercise

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has estimated Portuguese children consume five times more sugar than the recommended daily 5 percent.

Uber drivers to charge if kept waiting

Uber drivers are to start charging for each minute they are kept waiting, according to new policies announced this week by the global ride-providing company at the official inauguration of its new call centre in Porto.

The new waiting measure is to come into force from this week and will see drivers charge ten cents per every minute that they

are kept waiting after an initial two minutes.

On top of that, potential passengers will only have two minutes to cancel a

call, down from the previous five minutes, and will still be charged a €2.50 cancellation fee.

These are part of a set of several new measures drawn up to strengthen the positions of Uber drivers and passengers in Portugal.

Another change to be brought in relates to the evaluation of a driver: if a passenger does not want to give a driver a five-star rating on the app, a valid reason will have to be given. This is to prevent factors beyond the driver's control, such as traffic, being detrimental to the rating of the driver.

Furthermore, Uber is to implement a measure that will protect its drivers to ensure a journey does not last longer than 45 minutes, should they have personal commitments.

The company currently has close to 3,000 drivers in Portugal, and its services, an alternative to the standard taxi, are available in Lisbon, Algarve and Porto.

The British foreign minister, Boris Johnson, expressed confidence that a solution could be met that protects the rights of European citizens in the United Kingdom when he spoke about the Brexit negotiations during an official visit to Lisbon.



e also urged the European Union (EU) to move forward with the negotiations on the future economic situation.

"It is vital for both sides to reach an agreement, to protect the Europeans citizens' rights and

privileges and I am certain we will reach one. This is the message I have for our friends and partners in the EU and here in Lisbon," Boris Johnson said, after having met with the Portuguese Foreign Minister, Augusto Santos. Mr Johnson, who led the

Brexit campaign in the referendum that led to the UK's departure from the EU, said that the 400,000 Portuguese residents in the United Kingdom contribute to the country's life, culture and economy. He also acknowledged the three million British tourists

Portugal to beef up Venezuela consulates as crisis hits emigrants

Portugal's government is next year to beef up staff and technological resources in its consulates in Venezuela, its secretary of state for Portuguese communities announced during a visit to Caracas.

There are some 400,000 Portuguese nationals in Venezuela and more than a million children or grandchildren of Portuguese, making the community in the country the secondlargest in Latin America.

We [in 2017] adopted policies of reinforcing consular resources, which will continue to be intensified further in 2018,' said the secretary of state, José Luís Carneiro. "We're talking about reinforcing human resources and also technological resources that have to be modernised and adapted to the new needs. That is a commitment that has been made.

Carneiro was speaking at the end of a three-day trip to Venezuela during which he

He said that he had also

a detailed register of people and institutions that might need help at a difficult time.

Venezuela is mired in a deep political and economic crisis, with a standoff between the government and opposition.

According to Carneiro, at present some 3,500 nationals are receiving direct financial help from consular services. The focus, he stressed is on the elderly, children and women, with some of the aid taking the form of food and medicines.

The secretary of state also said that steps have been taken to improve action to promote the teaching of the Portuguese language - an essential tool for those members of the community who are returning to Portugal.

In Madeira - the Portuguese region from which most emigrants in Venezuela originally come the regional government estimates that at least 4,000 people have returned, and is preparing to welcome more. TPN/Lusa

Fewer Portuguese emigrating

More than 38,000 people left Portugal to live and work abroad last year, a number that fell for the third consecutive year, the 'Demographic Statistics 2016' issued by the National Institute of Statistics (INE), showed.

The INE said that 61 percent of all emigrants were men, 97 percent were Portuguese nationals and 76 percent went to live in a

European Union country. The vast majority (94 percent) were people of working age and 36 percent had completed the

9th grade while 41 percent had higher education.

The INE also said that 29,925 people came to Portugal to live for a period equal to or greater than a year in 2016 (permanent immigrants), a similar number to 2015 (29,896). TPN/Lusa

Rumours about NHR tax changes are an opportunity to take stock

Portuguese economy and finance publication Jornal de Negócios recently reported rumours that the Portuguese government is reviewing the terms of its non-habitual resident (NHR) taxation programme.



ccording to the newspaper, the government is considering introducing a flat rate of 5% or 10% on all income derived from expat pensions; however, the newspaper states that existing NHRs are unlikely to be affected and that only those resident in Portugal from the suggested date of 1 January 2018 will be subject to the tax.

Apparently, the government wants to preempt the possibility of having to renegotiate any double tax treaties regarding pension income and believes that a flat, catch-all tax represents the best solution under the circumstances. It also believes that such a programme would send out a clear, credible and emphatic message to the international community regarding Portugal's position on expats and international pensions.
As it currently stands,

Portugal's NHR tax regime is open to those who meet the following criteria:

• They are resident in

Portugal for more than 183 days in the calendar year.

 Their main place of residence (owned or rented) is in Portugal.

 They have income which is taxed within their country of origin.

British retirees should be reassured that the opportunity to become an NHR in Portugal is not limited to EU nationals. Even after Brexit, British Nationals will be able to use the Golden Residence Permit Programme (GRPP). Under this schemé they can make a capital investment in Portugal to receive residency or, more simply, can reside for 183 days or more per year in Portugal.

Portugal's favourable NHR tax system has been in existence for less than a decade. Before January 2009 expats in Portugal were charged as much as 56.5% tax. The NHR was a direct response to the problems caused by this punitive tax regime. In fact, it has been incredibly successful in attracting successful individuals and their families to Portugal

and is a major reason that Forbes recently voted Portugal's Algarve as the world's number one retirement destination.

To many it is the "Florida of Europe", but in reality it has its own distinct identity and offers so much more than amazing tax savings. It is also renowned for its reliable political and social environment, amazing coast, beautiful scenery, world-leading food, rich history and vibrant expat community.

Although it is undoubtedly wise for expats living in Portugal to act quickly and prudently to safeguard their finances and pensions in the most tax-efficient way, it is by no means guaranteed that the Portuguese government will follow through with any such proposals. In fact, previous plans for inheritance tax system changes were shelved as a result of a large amount of external pressure. Whatever the case, NHR changes are a routine matter of discussion and may occur at any time so good advice is critical to

ensuring that expats are not unnecessarily affected.

One thing is certain: rumours of changes to the NHR taxation programme are only likely to accelerate the decisions of potential expats; if they move now and ensure that they are resident as soon as possible, they are less likely to be affected.

Kneejerk reactions to what is, in effect, just a single newspaper article would be unwise. As Robert Mancera, Director and General Manager of Blacktower Financial Management comments, "Portuguese Tax Authorities have over the years demonstrated their ability to move quickly to make amendments to Tax Legislation - and more often than not leaving residents with very little time to 'plan' - which is never ideal.

"It would appear that the Authority has identified an opportunity to seek additional revenues through Pension Income by taxing those 'new' Expats with NHR tax status. It is still being

'mooted' and nothing is agreed but those individuals who see Portugal as the place to retire to may need to act fast to gain their NHR status before any changes come through.'

All the benefits are still there

In short, until there is any further and confirmed decision by the Portuguese government, NHRs, existing and new alike, remain able to enjoy the considerable benefits of the country's taxation programme.

This means they can be confident that they are immune to wealth taxes, are not required to make any minimum investment in the country and can freely move their capital.

Additionally, NHRs are still able to maximise all the legacy planning opportunities available to expats in Portugal. As

such, inheritance tax does not apply to assets held outside of Portugal, while spouses, descendants and ascendants remain able to inherit Portuguesebased assets without any form of inheritance tax at all. However, all income derived from a High Value Activity is subject to a flat rate of tax of 20%.

Seventeen people arrested in Lisbon dock drug bust

Seventeen people have been arrested in a drug bust after Portuguese PJ police intercepted a containership carrying over 1,000 kilos of cocaine.

he Portuguese navy, air force and national drug-combating unit joined the PJ in the operation, named Operation TAGA, staged at the start of this week and which aimed to clamp down on drug-trafficking at sea. A statement from the PJ explained the cocaine was found onboard the vessel after it was intercepted out at sea, and weighed 1,130 kilos in total. It was being ferried from Latin

America to Europe, where it was intended for distribution throughout various countries.

Seventeen people aged 24 to 63, all of foreign nationality, were arrested in connection with the bust. They are believed to form part of a transnational criminal organisation with roots in various countries on

different continents.
The containership was escorted to mainland Portugal, where it has been

retained at the Alcântara docks in Lisbon.

The operation was carried out following an exchange of information with the Lisbon-based Maritime Analysis and Operations Centre - Narcotics (MAOC-N).

An investigation is still ongoing under the PJ police, and is being carried out in collaboration with authorities in other countries including France and the UK.

Porto taxi among cars with most kilometres in world

A taxi in Porto has been found to be among the cars with the most kilometres on the clock in the world.

According to motoring magazine Autosport, the Portuguese Mercedes is presently resting in a Mercedes museum in Stuttgart despite being in great shape for such a well-travelled vehicle.

The white Mercedes-Benz clocked up a massive 1.9 million kilometres during its service life, and was used as a taxi for over a

However the Portuguese cab ranks only 6th on the top-ten list.

Filling the top five spots are a 1966 Mercedes Benz coupé, in 5th, with 2.06 million kilometres; a 1983 Lincoln Town Car from Kansas (US), which notched up 2.1 million kilometres placing it 4th; the 3rd most-used car in the world is a 1963 Volkswagen Beetle, with 2.6 million kilometres on the clock, and in second place, a 1971 Mercedes Benz from Greece, with 4.6 million kilometres.

The car with the most kilometres on the clock in the world is a 1966 Volvo P1800, which is still owned by its original owner, and, after having undergone three engine repairs, has covered 4.8 million kilometres.

Over the past few weeks the Institute for Nature and Forest Conservation (ICNF) had tried several. techniques to try and capture the elusive fox, but in the end it was a rubbish bin that saw the animal being caught, when it jumped in after food that had been discarded moments earlier by tourists and became stuck. Coimbra astronomer represents Portugal on ESO Users' Committee

The University of Coimbra has revealed that the researcher and astronomer Nuno Peixinho from the University of Coimbra Earth and Space Research Centre (CITEUC) has been selected to represent Portugal on the Users' Committee of the European Southern Observatory (ESO).

The astronomer is going to join the ESO advisory board and he is to ensure liaison between the astronomers in Portugal and the ESO regarding the evaluation by the Portuguese users of ESO's infrastructures and to assist ESO by reporting their operational plans to the

Portuguese community. The La Silla observatory is located about 600 kilometres north of Santiago de Chile, at an altitude of 2,400 metres on the edge of the Atacama Desert, where two other well-known observatories, Paranal and ALMA (Atacama Large Millimetre Array)are also located.

Nuno Peixinho said that the appointment represents a big responsibility since the Portuguese astronomer community heavily depends on ESO's Chile observatories

ESO is an intergovernmental organisation of science and technology for the design and operation of leading terrestrial astronomical observatories through international cooperation. TPN/Lusa





Energy companies record strong profits

Portuguese energy companies Galp and EDP have this week posted strong results following figures became relating to the end of September.



EDP saw its renewable energy division record strong growth in profits, latest figures have shown.

n the third quarter of the year, Portuguese oil and gas company Galp posted an adjusted net profit of €166 million euros, up €15 million from the previous quarter and an increase of €51 million (45 percent) compared to the same period of last year.

According to the third quarter results reported to the Portuguese Securities and Exchange Commission (CMVM), in the third quarter of the year EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortization) totalled €487 million, €103 million (27 percent) more than in the same period of 2016.

According to the company, EBITDA reached €1.379 million euros in the first nine months of the year, "of which 74 percent came from activities abroad."

The results reported to the CMVM also showed EBITDA of the Exploration and Production business of €215 million, €88 million higher than in the same period of 2016, bolstered by an increase in production and prices of oil and natural gas, although affected by the depreciation of the US dollar against the euro .

The EDIBTA of the G&P (Gas & Power)

business stood at €45 million, with sales to direct customers "offsetting the decline in volumes sold in the trading segment".

Average working interest production reached 94,600 barrels of oil per day, an increase of 28 percent over the same period of the previous year, "due to the progressive development of the Lula and Iracema projects in Brazil."

Investment amounted to €227 million in the third quarter, of which 82 percent was allocated to development and production activities, "namely in the BM-S-11 block in Brazil."

At 30 September, net debt stood at €1.5 billion, considering the loan to Sinopec as cash and cash equivalents, with the net debt to EDIBTA ratio being 0.9x.

On 27 October, Galp, through Petrogal Brasil, acquired a 20 percent stake in the Norte de Carcará license under the 2nd Production Sharing Round in Brazil. The consortium also includes Statoil (operator) and ExxonMobil, each with a 40 percent stake.

The consortium offered a profit oil share of 67.12 percent.

Meanwhile, Portugal's EDP

Renováveis on Tuesday reported a profit in the first nine months of the year that was almost five times that for the same period in 2016.

In a statement sent to the CMVM, the Madrid-based renewables unit of Portugal's Energias de Portugal (EDP) said that its nine-month net profit was €165 million, up 468 percent on the year-earlier period, when it had €29 million. It said the profit adjusted for non-recurring events was €160 million, up 45 percent from a year earlier.

That was on turnover of €1.346 billion, up 11 percent on the year. According to the company, this was largely thanks to "new operational capacity, a higher average selling price, together with the positive impact of the high usage factor of [wind] parks previously in operation."

Earnings before interest and tax rose 50 percent to €606 million, while EBITDA was up by 17 percent to €991 million.

The company's net profit in the first nine months of last year had been down 71 percent on the 2015 ninemonth figure, which was €100 million. TPN/Lusa

August unemployment revised down to 8.6 percent

Unemployment in Portugal fell to 8.6 percent in September, the National Statistics Institute (INE) said on Monday adding it had revised its unemployment figure for August down by 0.1 percentage points to 8.8 percent, the lowest figure since November 2008.

The figure calculated for August (8.8 percent) represents a fall of 0.1 percentage points over the previous month and 0.4 percentage points less than three months earlier, according to INE.

The provisional esti-

mate of the unemployed population was 442,000 people, having decreased by 2.1 percent (9,700) in relation to the previous month and 5.5 percent (25,800) compared to three months before.

More families seeking help with excessive debt - consumer group

Deco, Portugal's leading consumer association, has received requests for help in dealing with debt problems from 26,080 families so far this year, 50 more than in the same period of 2016, the group said.

Of the total approaches made to it in the period 1 January to 25 October, however, Deco has been able to help in just 2,001 cases in part because some families came to it too late, in some cases for legal reasons, the group explained to Lusa News Agency.

The 2,001 figure is up 16 on the equivalent at this time last year.

The most common cause for families to seek help from Deco this year is once more unemployment, which was cited in 30 percent of cases.

Worsening job conditions accounted for just over 23 requests, followed by debt collection/seizure of assets or income, divorce/separation and illness/disability, at 10 percent each.

Portugal's unemployment rate in September fell to 8.6 percent - its lowest level in almost nine years, as the economy continued to grow strongly.

However, both private and public indebtedness remain a major problem for the country.



To get one of these tickets, youths had to register online and if they won, they had to give their personal details. This information will be checked when they enter, specifically their age. The ticket prices for the general public are around

Without saying how many tickets had been sold so far, Paddy Cosgrave reckoned they would all be sold out by Sunday, the day before the Web Summit begins, between Monday and Thursday in Lisbon's Park of Nations. TPN/Lusa

"The consumer confidence indicator increased in October, after decreasing in August and September, returning to a level close to the maximum value of the series reached in July," INE said in a statement.

Sea minister talks to fishing industry about sardines

The sea minister, Ana Paula Vitorino, has met Portugal's purse seining organisations to inform them about the negotiations which took place with her Spanish counterpart late last week regarding the fishing limits and management plans for sardines in 2018.

An official source from the sea ministry told Lusa News Agency that the minister and the Secretary of state for fisheries, José Apolinário, met last Friday with purse seining organisations from the south and north of the country.

The minister said that the 2018 sardine catch limits for Portugal and Spain should range between 13,500 and 14,000 tons, which was one of the proposals the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) raised.

The Spanish fisheries ministry supported the proposal as it would help re-store fishing resources and keep the fishermen working

Minister Vitorino had earlier said that

sardine fishing was to be banned in some northern and central regions of Portugal, which are important for fish species reproduction. These limits are still to be defined.

The ICES recommended suspending sardine fishing in Portugal and Spain in 2018, however it also pointed out some other possible scenarios concerning the maximum catch limits on 20 October.

A day later the European Commission said that it would not forbid sardine captures due to their socioeconomic and cultural importance for the country, although it recommended caution and awareness regarding the environmental costs it might cause if nothing changes.



Catalonia: The Silent Majority



It's been going on for a while. "Recently in Catalonia we have been living through a kind of 'soft' totalitarianism...the illusion of unanimity created by the fear of expressing dissent," wrote best-selling Catalan author Javier Cercas in the Spanish newspaper El Pais in 2014. Those who didn't want independence kept their heads down and their mouths shut, in other words.

hree years later, it has just got worse. Last July, leading Catalan filmmaker Isabel Coixet told The Observer that "Madrid is deaf and mute and the government here (in Catalonia) is really happy about that. They never really look for dialogue at all." She added that Catalans are afraid of speaking out

"for fear of being called fascists." That about sums it up. Opinion polls consistently show that a majority of the people who live in Catalonia want it to remain part of Spain. The latest, published in El Pais on Saturday, showed that 55% per cent of those polled opposed the declaration of independence in the Catalan parliament last week, with only 41%

That's an even more decisive rejection of separation from Spain than a poll commissioned by the Catalan government and published just before the declaration of independence, which came out 49%-41% in favour of remaining in Spain. Yet the news coverage was all about flag-waving nationalist crowds demanding independence, because the silent majority was staying low. Finally, on Sunday, a big pro-Spanish crowd came out in the streets of Barcelona: 300,000 people according to the police, more than a million according to the organisers. About the same size as the pro-independence crowds, therefore, but they left it rather late. The separatist strateav has worked well, and by now the fat is really in the fire. The separatists' problem was this: no opinion poll has ever shown a majority for independence since the current upsurge in Catalan nationalism began about eight years ago. For the past few years the 'yes' vote has been stuck at around 40%. You can hardly declare independence for the region without a vote of some kind, so what do you do? A referendum is better than an election, because it's a singleissue vote that will really get the faithful out. But how do you prevent the more numerous sceptics from voting too? Well, the Spanish constitution is a great help there, because it says that a referendum on independence for any

of Spain's regions would be illegal. So if you hold one, maybe the true nationalists will vote despite the law, while the rest obey the law and stay away.

They road-tested this model three years ago with an 'advisory' referendum that the Madrid government sort of tolerated (though it said it was illegal), and it worked just fine. Only 37% of the population voted, but 80% of those who did show up voted 'yes' to independence That's the kind of number you

could really use to justify declaring independence, even if it's a bit of a cheat. If anybody complains, just shrug your shoulders, say you wish the turn-out had been higher, and carry on doing what you want to do: declaring independence. And so it came to pass. The independence referendum on 1 October was the real thing, not 'advisory' at all. Rather late in the day Spanish Prime Minister Maria Rajoy realised that the independentistas intended to use the result as a justification for a declaration of independence, so he got a court judgement confirming that the referendum was illegal and sent the police in to shut it down.

The Catalan nationalists had foreseen this, and welcomed it. Nothing could be better for the cause than images of Spanish police dragging women out of polling booths, and the uproar would keep even the hardiest 'no' voters away. The turn-out this time was a bit higher, at 43%, and so was the 'yes' vote: 90%. Very gratifying.

With that manipulated result in hand, the president of Catalonia's regional government, nationalist leader Carles Puigdemont, declared independence last week. The Spanish central government immediately dissolved the regional parliament, removed Puigedemont and his cabinet from office, and announced a fresh regional election for 21 December.

It's all strictly in accord with Article 155 of the Spanish constitution, and Puigdemont probably foresaw this too. He has always been three moves ahead of Madrid. Meanwhile, Spains's Deputy Prime Minister Soraya Saenz de Santamaria now has the job of running Catalonia until the election, and she will probably have a very difficult time.

Puigdemont is now officially a martyr in the eyes of his fellow separatists, and Spain says that he will be allowed to run in the December election, so he has lost nothing. Unless the silent majority find their voices, he may yet be the first president of the Catalan Republic

AAA Talks



On Tuesday 7November, the Algarve Archaeological Association (AAA) will be presenting two lectures, in English, by Dr Tatjana Kytmannow. The first lecture will be at 2.30pm at the Museu do Traje in São Brás, the second lecture will be at 5.45pm at the Convento de São José in Lagoa.

Dr Tatjana Kytmannow will be talking about Irish Megalithic tombs and comparing them to the megaliths of Southern Iberia. Ireland has one of the densest concentrations of megaliths in Europe (including 1600 megalithic tombs and 1500 cairns) dating in general to the Neolithic and Chalcolithic period. Their survival has been aided by superstition and non-invasive (grazing) agricultural practices. The first megaliths were constructed at c3800BC with one important outlier, Poulnabrone portal tomb in Co Clare. Of the megaliths, it is passage tombs that show the greatest variety in architecture, decoration and orientation to celestial bodies and landscape setting and they have clear parallels in Britain and on the continent.





The right tools for the job

As you begin to rake leaves, trim shrubs and shape trees in the garden in autumn, we look at essential tools to help you get the job done quickly.

o, are you ready for the great garden tidy-up, when you empty pots of wornout summer bedding, prepare your lawn for winter, trim hedges and rake leaves? There are a range of tools which will help you make light work of the most arduous jobs.

Invest in pruning tools

Some pruning can be done in the autumn to get rid of dead wood and help shape shrubs and trees for the following year. Secateurs are essential for this job and there are two types, anvil and bypass. The anvil works on the principle of a sharp blade cutting down on to an anvil, but the cutting blade needs

to be effective. Bypass secateurs work whereby a sharp curved blade bypasses a curved cutting plate, severing a branch without much effort. You shouldn't be trying to cut a branch with a diameter thicker than 1cm (0.5in) with secateurs. Any thicker and you should opt for a pruning saw such as the Silky, a Japanese blade with teeth with three razoredged facets which cut smoothly and don't leave loose edges. There are pocket types available, where the blade folds into the handle until you need to use it which are handy for carrying around routinely. If you are hard-pruning overgrown shrubs, loppers are invaluable. Some versions come with extendable arms for those branches which are just out of reach, and they are ideal for cutting out old congested wood from inside thorny shrubs such as berberis and roses, but they are also good for reducing the size of large branches you have already cut off with the saw, to make them more manageable to take to your local recycling centre.

Long-reach pruning

Pole pruners are also useful when it comes to shrubs that are too tall to reach and the ground's too uneven to safely place a ladder. These are basically secateurs attached to an extendable pole, operated by a trigger at the gardener's end of the pole. You may not be able to cut as accurately as you'd like, but it won't matter if the trees or shrubs are vigorous.

Rake it up

If you have plenty of trees, you're going to need a decent lawn rake to gather up the leaves which have amassed on your lawn or in your flowerbeds. If not dealt with, leaves can harbour pests and diseases over winter and could leave you with a shed load of problems next year. Use either a wide fanshaped springy metal rake for the job or a similar plastic version. The important thing is that the rake achieves a

good span of the area and preferably has forks which curve inwards at the end, to allow a maximum sweep. Make sure your rake has a strong, long handle. If you want to scarify your lawn, a springtine rake is ideal for the job as it will remove moss and thatch as you rake, allowing new shoots through in spring. You may also want to make use of a garden fork to make holes in the lawn to aerate it and reduce compaction, and fill the holes with sharp sand to aid drainage.

Mow away problems

Lawnmowers can help reduce problems with leaves on the lawn, if you just raise the blades and mow the grass, the leaves

should be chopped up and collected in the grass box, ready for composting. If your grass edges have become out of control and invaded by weeds, the perfect tool for tackling rough areas is a brushcutter, a bladed tool which will tackle long grass and weeds.

Trim hedges

Give your hedges a trim before the winter months, but make sure you leave enough greenery for birds to nest in and be careful where you trim in case you disturb any wildlife. Electric hedgetrimmers do the job if you have a power source handy and aren't prone to cutting through cables, but there are equally good battery-powered hedgetrimmers on the market, which provide just as good a cut and some recharge within half an hour.

Blow leaves away

If you have a larger area, use a leaf blower to direct leaves into a pile before bagging them up for the compost bin or to make leaf mould, which can be used as a mulch on beds and borders.

borders.
Talking of mulching, if you have a lot of garden debris which you want to break down, such as thick twigs and logs, it might be worth investing in a shredder which will munch thicker clippings into an ideal mulch for your plants, but don't put in seeding weeds, spiny prunings or diseased plants. The disadvantage of these is that they are pretty noisy, so the investment may not go down well with the neighbours.



Pet owners, it's time to be honest - have you ever taken a sick day when you were actually fine yourself but your furry friend was unwell

Well if you have, you are far from the only one out there to be guilty thanks to a new survey by Animal Friend pet insurance.

According to the survey, a third of pet owners in the UK were found to have skipped out of work for the day to look after their pet, with 42% of the owners having lied to their boss about being ill when the truth was that they were actually looking after a pet. It was found that men were more likely to tell the truth about taking the day off, with 63% saying they would own up compared to 54% of women, however, women were also more likely to leave their sick pet at home compared to men. It appears that younger pet owners are more inclined to take a sick day with the survey finding 40% of 18 to 24 year olds saying they

e on a shoestring

There are only three of these hellish gardens in the world, so it's worth making the effort to this oddball theme park on a hill in Pasir Pajang. Admission is free, and the garden is open daily from 9am-5pm.

3. Sample the street food scene

Eating out is a national pastime in Singapore, with some of the best value meals to be found at hawker centres (food courts) dotted around the city.

There are more than a hundred to choose from, housing close to 6,000 food stalls, and for as little as SGD\$5, you can sample an eclectic mix of Malay, Indonesian, Korean, Indian, Thai, Japanese and Vietnamese dishes. Diners can enjoy an openair experience in the evening at Lau Pa Sat (laupasat.biz), where tables are set up on streets closed off to traffic, while Makansutra Gluttons Bay (makansutra.com) serves up stunning night-time views of the city, alongside a helping of satay sticks, chilli crab and laksa.

4. Tuck into the world's cheapest Michelin-star meal

Aside from the scrumptious street fare, the city also offers the world's cheapest Michelin-starred meal. Located in Chinatown Complex on 335 Smith Street, the Liao Fan Hong Kong Soya Sauce Chicken Rice & Noodle was once a

after being awarded a Michelin star in 2016, it has become the go-to place for Chan Hon Meng's worldfamous chicken rice dish which costs a mere SGD\$3.80.

The establishment is said to be popular among celebrities, and David Beckham apparently turned up for a feed last vear.

5. Grab some bargains Those wanting to splurge without reaching deep into their pockets can head over to SCAPE Marketplace (scape.sg/marketplace), just off Orchard Street. It's open on Friday, the weekend, and public holidays from noon to 10pm, and sells clothes, accessories and soft furnishings. For SGD\$50, you can come home with a chunky necklace, a pair of flat shoes and a canvas tote bag with change to spare. A 20-minute ride away,

fashionistas will feel right at home on Bugis Street, surrounded by the latest trends, while Haji Lane is dotted with independent stores where shoppers can find a treasure trove of knick-knacks.

6. Explore Singapore's ethnically diverse areas Singapore is one of the most culturally diverse countries in Asia. Little India is a microcosm of the big subcontinent that's 2,000 miles away, with colourful buildings, exotic sounds and intriguing spicy smells.

Kampong Glam is a trendy enclave offering a taste of Malaysia, while the vibrant Chinatown is a great place to soak up the melting pot of Peranakan culture, where Indonesia, China and Malaysia meet.

7. Check out downtown Singapore on a Bumboat Bumboats (small water taxis) are a great way to see the city and its stunning

architecture. As well as enjoying the dramatic evening light show at Marina Bay, the boat ride is great for other picturesque sights - including the famous Merlion statue (a mythical creature with the head of a lion and body of a fish), the unique lotus-shaped ArtScience Museum and the statue of Sir Stamford Raffles, the founder of the port-city of Singapore.

A one-stop trip costs

SGD\$3, while 40-minute river tours are priced at SGD\$25 per passenger. Tickets can be purchased from the jetty kiosks.

8. Have a traditional breakfast at a kopitiam (coffee shop)

Head off the beaten track at Heap Seng Leong kopitiam, a quaint coffee shop at Block 10 North Bridge Road, serving a traditional breakfast of kopi (Singaporean coffee) and toasted sweet sandwiches filled with butter and locally-made Kaya jam. Kopi gu you (coffee with butter), toast and soft boiled eggs costs around SGD\$4.

9. Spend a day on Sentosa Island

A 20-minute car journey from the city centre, Sentosa island is home to several entertainment complexes and beaches.

Despite the number of swanky bars, there are still plenty of things to do that won't break the bank. A walk across the Floating Bridge at Siloso Beach offers uninterrupted, picturesque views of the South China sea - perfect for envy-inducing Instagram posts.

. And at 11 storeys high, the Fort Siloso Skywalk trail is a scenic trek among the treetops to a 19-century fort. All are free to visit.

10. Gaze at the Gardens By The Bay light show Save the best for last and head over to the Gardens

By The Bay (gardensbythebay.com.sg/ en), a nature park built on reclaimed land, for a dazzling light show at the Supertree Grove vertical gardens.

The towering man-made tree sculptures, which


harvest solar energy to generate their own light, are a sight to behold as they illuminate every evening at 7.45pm and 8.45pm.

The new THE Nigella' SAVVY COOK. @IzyHossack 'My aim is maximum flavour for minimum effort, without breaking the bank

The 20-year-old foodie is best known for her blog, Top With Cinnamon, and matching Instagram account (229k followers and counting), where she posts beautifully-lit photos of oozing chocolate chip

cookies and chunks of pecan-studded brownies. The Savvy Cook, however, draws on how she went about feeding herself as a first-year student. Why not try out three of her recipes from her new book?

Fresh young talent

Izy Hossack is celebrating finishing her second year at Leeds University, where she studies food science and nutrition, by publishing her second recipe collection, The Savvy Cook.

Lime-chilli corn and crispy onions

(Serves 2) 3tbsp olive oil 1/2 red onion, thinly sliced 1tbsp plain flour 2 ears of fresh corn, kernels cut off with a knife 1.5tsp honey Juice of 1/2 lime 1/2-1 jalapeno chilli 30g feta, crumbled Salt

1. Line a plate with kitchen paper. Heat the oil in a small frying pan over a high heat. Reduce the heat to medium-low, then toss the onion with the flour and fry in the oil until golden. Remove the onion from the pan with a spoon or tongs, leaving behind some of the oil and place the onions on a prepared plate. Sprinkle with salt and set aside. 2. Place the pan back on the heat. Add the corn kernels and turn the heat up to high. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the corn is nice and

hot. Add the honey, lime juice and jalapeno chilli and stir to combine. Season with salt to taste.

3. Remove the pan from the heat and transfer to a serving platter. Adorn with some crumbled feta and the crispy onions and serve.

Mushroom, sage and garlic pasta (Serves 2)

125g dried pasta or 250g cooked 4tbsp olive oil 1tbsp plain white flour 300ml vegetable or chicken stock 20g Parmesan, finely grated (or other hard

cheese) 1 bay leaf 4 large sage leaves 100g chestnut or button mushrooms, sliced 3tbsp dried breadcrumbs 1 garlic clove, crushed or very finely chopped

1. If starting with dried pasta, place the pasta in a medium pan and cover with justboiled water from the kettle. Bring to the boil and cook until al dente (this will generally be the shorter cooking time on the packet). Drain, reserving a small mugful of the pasta water.

2. Heat one tablespoon of the oil in a medium pan over a medium heat. Add the flour and stir for one minute then reduce the heat to low and gradually pour in the stock, stirring well between additions, until all the stock has been added. Stir in the Parmesan and add the bay leaf. Simmer for five minutes, stirring occasionally, then season with salt to taste.

3. Heat the remaining oil in a small frying pan over a medium-high heat. Add the sage leaves and fry until crisp. Drain on kitchen paper and set aside.

4. Add the sliced mushrooms to the pan and cook over a medium heat for five to seven minutes until dark and soft. Pour the cooked mushrooms into the sauce and return the frying pan to the heat.

5. Add the breadcrumbs, garlic and a pinch of salt to the frying pan and toast, stirring constantly but gently, for two minutes, so the garlic cooks and the breadcrumbs are crisped. 6. Remove the bay leaf from the sauce and pour it over the cooked pasta. Stir



together and splash in a little of the reserved pasta water to loosen the mixture, if needed. Divide between dishes, then top with the mushrooms, breadcrumbs and crispy sage, and serve.

Chocolate chip, raspberry and almond cake

(Serves 6) 80ml olivé oil, rapeseed oil or melted unsalted butter, plus extra for greasing 80g oat flour, plus extra for dusting (blend 80g of any type of plain oats you have in a food processor, until it becomes a rough flour) 80g ground almonds 80g soft brown sugar 1/4tsp salt 1/2tsp baking powder

1 large egg 4tbsp milk or non-dairy milk 1/2tsp almond extract 35g plain dark chocolate (at least 70% cocoa solids), finely chopped 100g frozen or fresh rasp-

To serve: Whipped cream or natural

herries

yogurt Fresh raspberries

1. Preheat the oven to 180C fan/200C/Gas Mark 6 and grease a 23cm cake tin with oil, then dust with flour, tipping out any excess. 2. Mix the ground almonds, oil, sugar, flour, salt, baking powder, egg, milk and almond extract in a medium bowl until smooth. Pour the batter into the prepared tin. Sprinkle over the chopped chocolate and raspberries and slightly swirl them into the batter with a spoon.

3. Bake in the oven for 30-35 minutes until the middle of the cake springs back when you apply light pressure with your finger.

4. Remove from the oven and leave the cake to cool in the tin. Once completely cooled, slice and serve as is, or with whipped cream or yogurt and fresh raspberries.

Stop being ashamed of your body

Many new mums loathe the shape of their bodies after they've had a baby. But they need to learn to love their new shape, because as well as damaging their own self-esteem, they might be sparking a body confidence crisis in their own children, experts warn.

study by parenting site Channel Mum found four in 10 children have said they feel fat or don't like their tummy, a third have asked to go on a diet, and 14% have insisted they don't like their body.

Another one in 10 kids think their bottoms are too big, after hearing their mums' similar lament.

Overall, seven in 10 mums say their young children have repeated negative phrases about their appearance after hearing their mothers say it first.

So unless mums learn to love their

new shape, they may pass their body issues on to their children.

Be proud of stretchmarks

"Having a bit of a mum tum or some stretchmarks isn't shame-

ful, it's a badge of honour for what your body has gone through," stresses Siobhan Freegard, founder of ChannelMum.com. Many mums (71%) say they've received negative comments about their post-baby body from both family members and strangers. As a result, the average new mum spends an astonishing £1,871 attempting to get her prepregnancy figure back. But almost three quarters (72%) of mums don't achieve it, and admit to being far less body confident after giving birth.

Bodyshaming 'Ridiculous'

"Bodyshaming in all forms is wrong, but criticising a woman for looking a little different when she's grown a whole new human is ridiculous," insists Freegard.

"Of course it's good to be fit and healthy, but we shouldn't be so obsessed with perfection that we raise a generation of children with body hang-ups.

"Giving birth is the most extreme thing a woman's body can do, so of course the shape is going to change. Having a post-birth body is something to be celebrated, not shamed."

Worryingly, 7% of mums admit to

Worryingly, 7% of mums admit to trying to lose weight while pregnant, and a further 16% consider it, despite the proven health risks. After giving birth, one in 40 resort to expensive body shaping surgery, and 35% say they'd have surgery if they could afford it. Anti-stretch mark treatments are another popular option, while half join a diet club and 13% hire a personal trainer.

Positive role-models

Many mums (75%) are calling for advertisers to use more realistic mum body images in commercials, including ditching images of bikini-clad new mums with taut stomachs on the beach.

They also want celebrities to be more honest, and for those claiming to 'snap back into shape' after childbirth to reveal they've actually followed an intensive diet and exercise regime.

Almost two thirds of mums say they now follow celebrity mums who've been open about their post-birth bodies on social media, with Giovanna Fletcher, Louise Pentland, Rebekah Vardy and Charlotte Louise Taylor voted the most inspiring.

And mums want more ordinary mums to share post-baby body snaps online, with 85% wanting post-birth bodies to be celebrated, whatever their shape.

Love your post-birth body

Mums' favourite post-birth body part is breasts, loved by a third of mums. Another third say they're proud of their stretchmarks, 21% like their C-section scar, and 23% are happy with their curvier 'mum tum' stomach - like Rebekah Vardy, wife of Leicester City striker Jamie Vardy.

The mum-of-four was criticised by Twitter trolls for being "huge" after the birth of baby Finley in January this year, but she hit back saying her post-pregnancy figure was normal, and proudly posed for photos in just her bra and knickers three months after the

The WAG said she was proud of what her body had achieved, and rightly so.

Journaling to help mental health

Ollie Aplin admits writing a journal felt strange at first - "I didn't know what I was supposed to write" - and it took a while to get into the habit.

ut he persevered, and doing so proved a "gamechanger" for his own mental health and wellbeing, helping him manage post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and panic attacks.

"Put simply, journaling gave me the space to learn how to talk about how I felt," says Ollie, 31. "And that's changed my life in so many ways, from my relationships, to how I deal with life in general. And how to cope with living with anxiety, PTSD and stress.' He's just released This Book Will Make You Stronger, the second in his MindJournal 'movement', to help others embark on their own journaling journeys towards healthier minds.

The original MindJournal basically, journals designed specifically to appeal to men, with questions and tasks, alongside space to write, to help guide people through the process was launched through a Kickstarter campaign early last year.

Within just 72 hours, Ollie had reached his target and was able to make his vision a reality. Now, This Book Will Make You Stronger takes it a step further, providing not just a safe space for getting your thoughts down on the page, but the tools to help identify triggers and develop ways of managing them, featuring 30 writing exercises and three core stages - Warm Up, Hurdles, and Strength

(Ollie describes it as a workout for the mind"). We're getting better at talking about mental health and that one in four people experience some sort of mental health issue each year. But while women are more likely to be diagnosed with anxiety and depression, men are affected, too, though they're often less likely to talk about it. This can have devastating consequences: suicide remains the single biggest killer of men aged under 50, and according to the Men's Health Forum, 76% of UK suicides are by men. Ollie had a mental break-

down in his early-20s, two years after losing his mother, who had bipolar disorder, to suicide when he was 19. "My mum was an immensely private and paranoid person from her bipolar. I was told from an early age not to mention anything that ever happened. This stuck with me after her suicide. People would ask if I was OK, and I'd respond like I always had done: 'Yeah, fine'," he recalls.

"When I finally had a breakdown, it was like my mind was telling me it was time

But talking didn't come easy. "I physically didn't know how," says Ollie. "I'd sit in my sessions with my therapist and struggle to

It was his therapist who suggested he try writing things down instead. She gave him lists of feelings "to pick from and circle" every time he journaled, and set tasks like writing down why he was feeling that way. "This meant every time I journaled, I had something to write about," says Ollie. "Writing on a blank piece of paper is hard for anyone; where do I start, what do I want to say...? And most of the time, the self-imposed pressure cripples us to the

point where our minds are blank, then we get frustrated and tell ourselves we can't do it.

"That's why prompts help," he adds. "They give you a starting point, something to spark your brain into think-

ing and your body into feeling. Once you're at that point, the words just appear and you're ready to write."

Anxiety is still part of Ollie's life, but journaling means he now has the tools to deal with it in a healthy way. But mental health is something everybody should be thinking about not just those who've had a breakdown or are having therapy or treatment for specific conditions. And there are no rules - do what works for you. The beauty of MindJournal is that you can dip in and out and write as much or little as you want.

"For me, journaling is like a type of medicine. Something I keep in my mental medicine cabinet for when life gets too much," says Ollie. "My mental medicine cabinet's filled with things like meditation, running, counselling and journalising. All the things that help release the pressure in my mind and body. Sometimes I break out the medicine cabinet every day, and sometimes not so often."

"It makes sense that providing the body with a nutritional source of bioavailable type one collagen will allow replenishment of collagen stores in the dermis and help to boost the skin's natural scaffolding." Aston Martin presents the DB11

To dismiss the DB11 V8 as an entry-level version of Aston Martin's latest grand tourer wouldn't be entirely fair. Sure, with a retail price of €240,000 it's €35,000 cheaper than its V12-powered stablemate, but according to Aston this is an entirely different beast.





hile the full-fat DB11 V12 was designed for crossing continents in supreme comfort at a significant rate of knots, Aston Martin claims the V8 model is the one to go for if you're a keen driver. Yes, it's about 100hp down on the V12, but the lack of those four extra cylinders right over the front of the car mean the V8 is 115kg lighter, and it also means this particular Aston Martin has a weight distribution of 49:51 as opposed to its big brother's 51:49. The clue is in the name. The most important change with the DB11 V8 is, well, the V8. Aston Martin got its hands on the AMGsourced unit thanks to its working relationship with the Daimler Group. But more on this phenomenal engine later. Aside from that new engine, the changes you get with the DB11 V8 are rather subtle. Aesthetically, its darker headlamp bezels, different vents in the bonnet, and darker tail lights are the main alterations the more eagle-eved will pick out. These changes have been introduced to give the

model.

may have been sourced from Mercedes' slightly mad in-house tuners AMG, it hasn't just been dropped into the British grand tourer as is. Aston Martin has fitted its own air intake, exhaust and wet sump lubrication systems, and has worked to "Astonise" the German engine. The result of this tinkering is a 4.0-litre, twin-turbocharged V8 that develops 503bhp and 675Nm of torque. This allows the DB11 to complete the benchmark sprint from 0-100km/h in just 3.9 seconds, while its top speed sits at 300km/h. For perspective, the V12 DB11 will complete the same sprint in 3.7 seconds, so the V8 won't exactly be left for dead by its more expensive stablemate.

While this likely won't be a huge concern for Aston Martin owners, the DB11 V8 trumps the V12 model as far as fuel economy and CO2 emissions are concerned. In a word, the DB11 V8 is sublime. Aston Martin has built a thoroughly accomplished GT car that's not only devastatingly quick in a straight line, but seriously impressive through the twisty stuff as well.

The steering is precise and has a healthy weight to it, allowing you to point the car's nose into a bend safe in the knowledge that it won't suddenly wash out. Aston has also worked a trick with the DB11's damping. The set-up is soft enough to allow the car to ride comfortably over imperfections in the surface of the road, but firm enough to minimise body roll through fast corners. Out on the motorway, the DB11 really comes into its element. It simply eats the miles up, and is an incredibly comfortable car to cover great distances in. The V8 engine has power on tap, and even in seventh gear it pulls astonishingly well.

If there's one thing an Aston Martin has to be, it's beautiful, and the DB11 is certainly a stunning thing to look at. Where its sister car, the Vanquish, is far more aggressive in its appearance, the DB11 is a much more elegant and classy GT.

Anyone who has spent time in a Mercedes will no doubt be met with a sense of deja vu, due to the infotainment system being lifted straight from the German manufacturer's model line-up (another fruit of Aston and Daimler's relationship).

Past that, though, the DB11 is all Aston Martin, There's leather all over the place, which has been sourced from cows raised in fields that aren't fenced in with barbed wire. According to Aston Martin, this helps to ensure the leather is of the highest quality. One thing's for sure: the DB11's cabin is a great place to spend time.

The DB11 V8 bears a recommended retail price of €240,769, so it's certainly not cheap. That said, it is intended to be an exclusive, luxurious GT car, so an affordable price tag was never going to be on the table. As far as equipment goes, there's a full leather interior, an infotainment system with 12-inch LCD display, satellite navigation and 360-degree parking camera, to name but a few features

And if you think you'll tire of listening to the car's V8 soundtrack. you can also order your DB11 with a premium Bang & Olufsen audio system. Although the DB11 V8 may be

down four cylinders compared with the range-topping V12, by no means should you think that it's in any form a lesser car. Like the DB11 V12, it's a marvellous cross-continental grand tourer, but thanks to its new lightweight engine, the DB11 V8 is now more agile than ever. For those who value outright dynamic ability over challenging roads, this might just be the car to go for.

Tough enough already



Golf is big business in the Algarve. Sitting in the reception of our academy we get to see the planes landing at Faro almost like clockwork, every five minutes.

dmittedly, every passenger is not a golfer, it would be fair to say that there is a higher percentage of golfers travelling to the Algarve than most anywhere in Europe (Costa del Sol excluded). Have you ever watched the late Robin Williams' comedy sketch, where he puts on a very believable Scottish accent, describing the potential origins of the game? The core essence of the sketch is that one individual is talking to his friend about a game which he has invented. His friend asks whether it is just played over the one hole, where the 'creator' say's "Hell no!" (at least that's the Parkinson interview version) "It's over eighteen! And we will put a flag in a hole, so when you get close it will give you hope!"

I am not sure whether Robin Williams ever played the game, yet his observations were so insightful making the great game we love so much, look ridiculous. Why would anyone want to make such a small ball, go with such a small club, to cover such a long distance, with obstacles and hazards abounding not once but eighteen times. What's even more perplexing is how did the game take off, in Scotland, where the weather isn't known for its warmth or dryness.

Yet, here we are, the game has become a world-wide success and has been reinstated into the Olympics, Golf, in Tiger, recently had the highest paid athlete of all time in its ranks. So something about the game has captured the human imagination and grown to a multi- billion pound industry Having just flown back from the UK, yesterday, if you ever have a chance to look down, when the clouds give you a chance, the amount of golf courses which can be seen is staggering. The landscape of the whole countryside has been

carved into a different shape, by the invention of the game. I can't think of another sport, which has had such an impact on the landscape worldwide. Some might say that the game has created its fair share of misery alongside frustration and the occasional fleeting moments of joy. Yet the purpose of the game is so simple, to get the ball in the hole in as few shots as possible. You can use whichever club, at whatever time, wherever you want. You walk for around four hours, with only a minute and a half of action with you actually hitting the ball infrequently, in the direction intended. Remembering that the purpose of the game is to get the ball in the hole in as few shots possible, imagine my surprise last week when giving one of my clients the choice of, "Shooting in the low seventies, regularly, with only a few light changes, or swing the club in a 'pretty' way, with a lot of hard work, and shooting in the eighties." He chose the eighties route. It went totally against my tournament playing, competitive instincts. Imagine having a conversation with a Tournament Professional, explaining to him, that his scores could be significantly reduced by changing his alignment and practice habits, say take at least one or

average.
These changes would take about a week of hitting balls, forty hours of practice, on the range.
The Tournament player rejects this course of action and goes for the option of his swing looking good on the range, taking months to perfect the new move and missing every cut.



performance at Old Trafford this week, but a lack of fortune

On Halloween Night it was the Red De who got all the luck as Benfica's teenage keeper, Mile Svilar, unwittingly put José Mourinho's men on course for another narrow win and virtually ensured that Manchester United will proceed to the knock-out stages of the Champions League.

few weeks ago the young Bel gium keeper made his debut for the Eagles at the Algarve Stadium against Olhanense in the Portugal Cup. Days later the youngest goalkeeper to ever play in the Champions League was facing Manchester United at the Estádio da Luz where his historic night ended in embarrassment after he misread a Marcus Rashford free-kick and carried it over the line. But Old Trafford was looking a much better venue for the young man as he saved Anthony Martial's early penalty.

Benfica were justifiably aggrieved not to have been awarded a spot-kick at the other end when midfielder Pizzi was felled by Eric Bailly near the byline. Minutes later David de Gea's brilliant save from a clean hit by Diogo Gonçalves was turned over the crossbar as the visitors took the game to United. In injury time at the end of the first-half Svilar was again the centre of attention as former Benfica favourite Nemanja Matic's shot came off a post and ricocheted off the keeper's back before rolling into the net. In the second period the introduction of Rashford

for Martial fired up the home side.

Two minutes later he won a penalty which Blind drilled home to make it 2-0 and an ignominious exit from the Champions League for the famous Lisbon club that is in the midst of its worst European run following five straight defeats.

At least they have a goalkeeper who, despite his torment this month, should have the courage to feature in future campaigns. Sporting were held 1-1 by last year's finalists Juventus at the Alvalade

The Lions had opened the scoring with a low shot from inside the area by Brazilian midfielder Bruno Cesar in the twentieth minute after Gelson Martins' strike was parried by Juventus keeper Gianluigi Buffon.

Juventus were outplayed by Sporting in the first-half but the Italian side improved significantly after the break with Argentinean international Gonzalo Higuain scoring a late equaliser after a perfect pass by Juan Cuadrado ten minutes from time. The draw kept the Italian

club in second place with seven points, three in front of Sporting and three behind leaders Barcelona with two matches remaining
