# 'Brexit an opportunity for Portugal'

Prime Minister António Costa believes Brexit is an opportunity for Portugal and Britain to strengthen their centuries-old alliance. The Portuguese Premier was speaking at the Bloomberg headquarters in London in an event destined towards generating British investment. While concerns have been raised as to the potentially adverse effects of the 2016 Brexit referendum, numbers revealed this week show that British investment in Portugal increased by more than 400 percent in 2017.

xplaining how he envisaged already strong Anglo-Portuguese relations improving even further, António Costa this week said that Brexit should be "transformed into an opportunity for both countries to deepen their special relationships, both on a political and economic level." Taking to Twitter shortly before returning to Portugal, the Portuguese Prime Minister also highlighted the importance of the UK to the safety and defence of Europe, while stressing the importance of safeguarding the rights of Portuguese residents in the UK and those of British expats living in Portugal during his meetings with his British counterpart Theresa May. He added: "What is important now is to minimise the negative consequences of Brexit and to develop a relationship which is as close as possible with the United Kingdom." Addressing the audience in English, the Portuguese Prime Minister referred to the 1386

Portugal and the UK the world's oldest allies, with António Costa pledging that the countries will always remain friends. "In Portugal, you can find a safe haven and fertile ground for your investment," he was quoted as saying in London by the Lusa News Agency, adding: "When businesses open in Portugal, they can have a two-in-one: Brexit in the UK and stay in the EU by investing in Portugal." The Portugal-UK forum, titled 'An Expanding Alliance', gathered some 200 participants, including representatives of the financial sector and entrepreneurs. Among the speakers was Bernardo Trindade, president of the Portugal IN special mission, a working group set up to attract UK investment in the context of Brexit, and Luís Castro Henriques, president of AICEP Portugal Global, the country's foreign trade and investment agency. According to figures released at the event, foreign direct investment in Portugal by UKbased investors last year rose 427 percent to €758 million,

ranking the UK fourth worldwide among foreign investors in Portugal. On a European level, the UK was the second biggest investor here in 2017. Nonetheless, in the year immediately preceding the Brexit ballot, British investment topped a record €853 million.

According to figures published by Lusa, the UK is the fourth largest

taker of Portuguese goods and services, with a total value of €8.074 billion last year, up 7.4 percent on the previous 12 months. Portugal enjoyed a surplus of €4.675 billion, given that it imported goods and services worth €3.399 billion from the UK

revenue from them swelled 14 percent to €2.591 billion, as the number of overnight stays rose 1.1 percent to 9.280 million. In a statement, a Downing Street spokesperson revealed the British Prime Minister said that the UK deeply values the longstanding alliance with Portugal and wants to maintain and strengthen those ties in future

across a range of areas, including science, defence, and trade and investment.

The spokesperson explained that the two leaders also discussed the recent attacks in Syria and Salisbury and "agreed that the international community needed to come together to uphold the worldwide prohibition on the use of chemical weapons.

Downing Street further revealed that British Prime Minister "underlined the value she places on the contribution of the Portuguese community in the UK, whereas Prime Minister Costa also welcomed the contribution of UK nationals in Portugal and expressed his desire to maintain a close relationship with the UK after exit.



# News in Brief

### Twin sisters suspected of killing newborn jailed

A woman suspected of stabbing her newborn baby to death in Seixal just south of Lisbon is to remain in custody along with her twin sister. Both women have been sent to a woman's prison facility in Sines pending trial. Police say the mother inflicted the fatal wound on the baby girl, though added they believed her twin sister was also criminally involved in the murder on Monday

### Doctors announce three-day strike

Portugal's doctors have announced a three-day strike for the start of next month. The country's doctors will be staging action on 8, 9, and 10 May. The Independent Doctors Union (SIM) calling for the action slammed Portugal's Finance Minister Mário Centeno for being "insensitive" and accused him of "playing with the feelings of the weak" by claiming it was normal for patients to wait up to two and a half years for a consultation.

### **Fatal student bus accident**

An accident involving a bus carrying students back from a spring break in Spain has resulted in the death of a 18-year old student. Officials said a further 48 students were injured in the accident in Nisa, central Portugal, though none are serious. The accident happened during severe weather conditions on Sunday evening in an area notorious for accidents, with the driver losing control before the bus flipped onto its side.

# No let up in the rain

The weekend will be mostly wet and dreary throughout the country and showers are forecast to stick around for most of the coming week, but the good news is that next week the temperatures will start to rise.

Lisbon: Saturday will be partly cloudy and Sunday will be rainy in the capital, but Monday and Tuesday should by dry with sunny spells. Light showers are forecast to return from the middle of the coming week, but temperatures - maximums and minimums - will rise by a couple of degrees

South: Southern Portugal looks like it could be the exception to the general rule; Saturday is forecast to be sunny, with some scattered cloud and highs of around 20 degrees Celsius, and the following week is forecast to be partly cloudy with highs in the low-20's.

North: Northern Portugal might be a little brighter than it has been in recent weeks, with sunny spells forecast through the weekend and for most of the coming week, but there will be no let up in the rain as persistent showers are forecast at least until the coming weekend.

# Ryanair threatens union over 'false allegations'

Ryanair said on Wednesday that it was considering suing the Portuguese cabin crew union if it continued with its "false allegations" that the airline breached Portuguese law during a recent strike by staff based in Portugal.

ichael O'Leary told reporters that he lowcost airline said it may have to go to court because it was a large employer and large investor in Portugal (...) and it was not willing to have its good name and reputation stained by false allegations made by a union with TAP representatives, Speaking to Lusa News Agency, he said letters would be sent to the union (SNPVAC) and the Working Conditions Authority guaranteeing that Portuguese law was not breached. The union has accused Ryanair of breaching Portuguese law by flying in foreign crews to cover Portuguese strikers and threatening dismissal to those who refused.

# TAP flights still being cancelled 'without explanation' as pilots are urged to 'work to rule'

The Portuguese national aviation authority (ANAC) said on Tuesday this week that it had recorded 26 flights cancelled by flag-carrier TAP between 26 and 29 March, affecting almost 4,000 passengers.

ANAC told *Lusa News Agency* it had called the airline's managers to explain what was going on and to keep passengers properly informed, and it is continuing to monitor the situation

The authority also said it was in permanent contact with the affected passengers who had got in touch to ask for help with refunds and compensation.

The Portuguese pilots' union (SPAC) said it has been appealing to pilots to 'work to rule'; to ask for overdue days off and not to accept flights on their days off and holidays as a means of pressuring the airline.

There have been scores of cancellations in recent weeks, Lusa News Agency says, without TAP giving any details.

The airline has said it "regrets"

the cancellations and it would compensate the affected passengers.

At the end of March TAP said passengers whose flights were delayed or cancelled during the last week of that month would receive compensation.

Consumer watchdog DECO says it has received numerous complaints with regards to cancelled TAP flights.

# Alert for airlines operating in the Eastern Mediterranean

European air traffic controllers have issued a "rapid alert" for airlines in the Eastern Mediterranean owing to the possibility of air strikes into Syria.

The European Aviation Security Agency's (EASA) warning of possible launches of air-to-ground strikes or cruise missiles comes as the US, Britain, France and allies weigh up retaliatory measures to a suspected chemical weapon attack in Syria.

The European Organisation for the Safety of Air Navigation, Eurocontrol, told operators on Wednesday: "Please note that EASA has issued Rapid Alert Notification for Eastern Mediterranean/Nicosia FIR (flight information region) area" stating that: "Due to the possible launch of air strikes into Syria with air-to-ground and/or cruise missiles within the next 72 hours, and the possibility of intermittent disruption of radio navigation equipment, due consideration needs to be taken when planning flight operations in the Eastern Mediterranean/ Nicosia FIR area."

he tourist chairman said the results proved that golf was an extremely important sector in Portugal and particularly in the Algarve" The Algarve is currently responsible for about 70 percent of the rounds of golf in Portugal with more than 1.3 million rounds in 2017 alone. The authority also said

that 87 percent of the players who were asked said they had played in the Algarve before, proving how satisfied the tourists were. Almost three-quarters of the players (73 percent) were British, a figure that is directly related with the number of flights between the British market and the south of Portugal.

# Portugal sees EU's second biggest increase in housing prices

Portugal recorded the second highest annual increase in housing prices (10.5 percent) in the fourth quarter of 2017, which increased more than twice as much as in the eurozone and the EU, Eurostat announced on Wednesday.

Between October and December 2017, according to the EU's official statistics office, the housing price index rose 4.2 percent in the eurozone and 4.5 percent across all 28 Member States, compared to the same quarter last year.

The highest increases in house prices, as measured by the housing price index, were recorded in Ireland (11.8 percent), Portugal (10.5 percent) and Slovenia (10.0 percent).

Just one country saw a reduction and that was Italy (-0.3 percent).

Compared to the previous quarter housing prices increased by 0.9 percent in the eurozone and 0.7 percent across the EU.

With regards to quarter-on-quarter rates, the highest increases were recorded in Slovenia (3.7 percent), Croatia (3.2 percent) and Cyprus (2.7 percent) with four declines: in Sweden (-2.8 percent), Denmark (-1.7 percent), Belgium (-0.4 percent) and Finland (-0.3 percent).

In Portugal, the indicator grew 1.2 percent from the third quarter to the fourth quarter of 2017.

### EC confirms increase in Portuguese road deaths

The number of deaths on Portuguese roads rose 14 percent in 2017 compared to the previous year, the second highest increase recorded in the European Union (EU), where the average fell by 2 percent, according to figures released this week by the European Commission.

According to preliminary figures for 2017 released in Brussels, the average number of deaths in road accidents in Portugal rose by 14 percent from 2016 to 2017 - the second highest increase among Member States after Cyprus (15 percent) - but decreased by 31 percent when compared to 2010 data.

In the European average there was a decrease of 2 percent over the previous year and of 20 percent compared to 2010.

In 2017, an average of 62 people per million died in Portugal (in the EU this average was 49 per million), whereas in the previous year there were 54 deaths (EU 50) per million.

In 2010, the average number of deaths on Portuguese roads was 80 per million and in the EU

of 63 per million inhabitants.

Sweden (25 deaths per million inhabitants), the United Kingdom (27), the Netherlands (31) and Denmark (32) réported the best results in 2017.

In relation to 2016, Estonia and Slovenia reported the largest decrease in the number of fatalities, respectively -32 percent and -20 percent.

# Villages at risk from forest fires to get safety officials, shelters

Villages in parts of Portugal at the highest risk from forest fires are to have a "safety official" charged with warning residents of dangers, organising evacuations and running awareness campaigns about fires, under two new government programmes unveiled on Monday.

he 'Safe Village' and 'Safe People' programmes - aimed at preventing and reducing the effects of fires - were developed together with local

councils. They were being presented and launched in Ansião, in Leiria district, one of the areas affected by the fires that devastated swathes of central Portugal in October.

The ceremony, overseen by the minister of internal administration, Eduardo Cabrita, was the stage for the signing of a protocol by the National Civil Protection Authority (ANPC), the

National Association of Portuguese Municipalities (ANMP) and the National Association of Parish Councils (ANAFRE) on the implementation of the two programmes.

These are to be implemented across the country, but their main target is the 189 municipalities with parishes at risk, with a view to "management of combustible [material], evacuation plan for villages and awareness campaigns," the minister told Lusa News Agency.

The function of the new "village safety official", he said, is to "transmit warnings to the population, organise the evacuation of the settlement if needed and to do awarenessraising actions among the population."

The programmes are also to define places of refuge in the villages and ensure locals know what to do in case of fire, as well as how to avoid risk behaviours. They will also mark evacuation

routes from villages.
There is also to be a nationwide campaign, starting in May, on radio and television, in newspapers and on social media, focussing on general measures to protect against fire.
The ministry expects the two programmes to be implemented from May, above all by local councils.

Under the protocol now to be signed, the ANPC is to distribute signage and 10,000 selfprotection kits and other equipment, list criteria for the identification of suitable refuges. create mechanisms by which residents can be warned, carry out local and national campaigns, and oversee drills. For their part, the ANMP and ANAFRE are to cooperate in distributing documents produced by the ANPC, organise information sessions for residents, create fire prevention measures, identify refuges and put up signs indicating TPN/Lusa evacuation routes.





# Association launches petition for show tickets to be slashed

The Portuguese Association of Shows, Festivals and Events (APEFE) launched a public petition at the start of this week in a bid to have VAT on live performances slashed from 13 percent to 6 percent.

round 400 people signed the petition addressed to Parliament in the first few hours of its launch.

The APEFE states that "13 percent VAT is unconstitutional" because "it promotes an increase in the price of tickets. limiting the demand of

citizens and consequently the fundamental exercise of each person's right to culture

"Almost four years have passed since the

departure of the troika, the country is in full recovery, but the 6 percent VAT rebate remains a deferred measure, unlike what happened in other

countries in the same situation as Portugal, as is the case in Spain, to cite an example", the petition's mission statement reads This is one of the main demands of the association, which was formally established in 2017 and unites some of the biggest promoters of shows in Portugal, such as Everything is New, Música no Coração, and Ritmos & Blues. After lending its support to artists last week in protest over better support for the arts, the association is now calling for "an urgent restructuring of cultural policy in all its aspects" Everyone has the right of access to culture, not just those who have buying power, and those who are penalised by the current tax situation of live shows are the Portuguese, it is the public", reads the petition's text. According to the most recent data released by the National Statistical Institute, in 2016 Portuguese families spent an average of €845 on leisure and culture

activities, or 4.2 percent of total expenses incurred. As for live performances which include rock concerts, fado shows. classical concerts, theatre, opera, dance, folklore or circuses - in 2016 there was an increase both in the number of spectators and in the income obtained. In total, 14.8 million spectators attended 32,182 live performances, but only 4.9 million paid for tickets.

The average price per ticket was more expensive in 2016, having gone up from €15.4 to €17.4.

Live shows generated a total of €85 million in revenue, which represented an increase of 42.6 percent on 2015, when the figure was 59.6 million euros. Theatre is a big

contributor to cultural activity, with the greatest number of shows per year, but the field that registered most spectators (7.3 million) and ticket revenue (€63.2 million) was music.

# Sea returns Austrian paragliders' bodies

The bodies of two Austrian paragliders missing since Monday at Meco beach near Sesimbra were found at about 9:30am on Thursday morning, the National maritime Authority told Lusa News Agency.

he search operation had been suspended at the time because of the bad weather. But just as the search and rescue teams were disbanding the sea gave up the bodies of both Austrian nationals within a few metres from where the search party had congregated to regroup, commander Fernando Pereira da Fonseca said. The accident happened on Monday when three Austrians, who were practicing paragliding, were swept out to sea. One of the paragliders, a

woman had landed on the beach very close to the water's edge and was dragged out to sea along with her paraglider. Two other Austrians from the same party, who had landed shortly before, went to rescue the woman but they too were swept away.

The body of the first victim, a 51-year-old man, was found on Monday.

The Austrian ambassador in Lisbon, Robert Zischg, said that following the fatal accident, the remaining members of the group had decided to cut short their stay in Portugal.

# Mystery enshrouds foreign girl found on Vila Real de Santo António beach

Portuguese police are trying to locate the family of a young woman believed to be a 20-year-old Hungarian, who was found on the Santo António beach, in the border town of Vila Real de Santo António (eastern Algarve), barefoot and dressed in summer clothing.

The young woman was, according to newspaper Correio da Manhã (CM), spotted on the beach by locals and grabbed attention as she was staring fixedly out to sea.

According to the newspaper, the woman was hostile when approached by

locals and "spoke in a mixture of English, German and Spanish".

Maritime Police were called and, as Commandant Fernandes da Palma, of the local Port Captaincy told CM, she "had no ID on her, just a few papers".

INEM emergency

medics were also called out, and the foreign woman was taken first to a local health centre, and then, reluctantly, to Faro Hospital's psychiatry ward.

The report states that when queried about her origins, the woman initially said simply she was a "citizen of the world", but later conceded her name is Sarcadi Tomas, and is a 20-year-old Hungarian national. However, at the time of going to press authorities were still trying to confirm her identity and locate family or anyone who could help in the identification process.

Portugal's Public Prosecutor has been made aware of the case.

# Urban renewal should include earthquake measures - specialists

A group of experts who took part in a debate on "Prevention and minimisation of seismic risk and reinforcement of seismic resilience in the city of Lisbon" said that urban renewal in the capital should include reinforcing buildings to withstand earthquakes.

The debate took place late last week at the premises of the Lisbon Municipal Assembly at the suggestion of opposition party CDS-PP.

The vice president of the Institute of Structural Engineering, Territory and Construction of Lisbon's Instituto Superior Técnico, Mário Lopes, began by saying that "it is important to incorporate seismic resistance in urban rehabilitation," or face the risk of buildings "that are deadly traps.

In the engineer's opinion, "the level of demand required in urban rehabilitation remains at zero," and "this continues to be done with the complicity of the Government, the Lisbon municipal council and the entities with responsibility in the matter.

One example is the "destruction of the Pombaline cage," an antiearthquake building technique, that uses a

wooden structure - or cage to reinforce brickwork walls introduced after the 1755 earthquake that is common in buildings in the downtown area of Lisbon, the destruction of which Lopes called "a cultural crime".

"Lisbon is the first city in the world built to withstand earthquakes, and we are destroying it ourselves," he added.

The director of the Faculty of Architecture of the University of Lisbon, João Pardal Monteiro, gave the example of homes that are fragile because they have knocked smaller rooms together.
"We have to make

people aware that we cannot make changes to this type of building without qualified technicians to do it." said the architect. explaining that these interventions will "remove the characteristics that withstand earthquakes."

Pardal Monteiro stressed that "interventions in the city have to be carried out with specialised technicians, so that this does not become a deck of cards ready to fall to the first earthquake.

The debate also recalled that the first "regulation that requires the seismic calculation for buildings dates back to 1958."

Closing the debate, the councillor for Housing of the City of Lisbon, Paula Marques, said that the municipality "has been developing several instruments in this area.' such as "updating the land chart, seismic index, and a manual of good practices in rehabilitation.

Professor José Luís Zêzere, of the Institute of Geography and Spatial Planning, stressed that "seismicity in Portugal is moderate," as "earthquakes of great magnitude occur at long intervals," but nevertheless considered that the "problem is big enough to be taken into consideration.'

# GNR closes down illegal Olhão casino

GNR police officers closed down a casino set-up operating illegally in an Olhão warehouse last Sunday.

Twelve people, aged 33 to 58, were identified and made formal suspects in the operation, three for illegal gambling and tax fraud, and the remainder for illegal gambling.

Offices staged six searches, one at the site where the casino was being illegally run, and others on two properties and three vehicles.

As a result more than €53,000 were seized,

"1,080 chips of varying values, 12 packs of cards, 15 dice, six mobile phones, three IT items, and two poker tables", the GNR listed in a statement.

The operation was spurred by an investigation into illicit exploitation of gambling and tax evasion, launched a year ago, and was carried out by the GNR Faro Territorial Command and the Faro district PSP police.

# Slump in 'Gold Visa' investment

Investments made in Portugal in return for 'gold visas' fell 46 percent in March, compared to the same month of 2017, to €103.3 million, according to statistics from the country's Foreigners and Borders Service (SEF).

n March, the investment resulting from the Residence Permit for Investment Activity (ARI), also known as gold visas, reached €103,343,928.34, down 46 percent from the same month last year (€192,493,840.26). Compared to February, investment increased by 13 percent. Of the total amount raised in March, most is related to real estate purchases (€92,719,248.13), with capital transfer raising €10,624,680.21. Last month, 174 residence visas were awarded under the scheme, of which 163 were granted following property purchases. Capital transfer accounted for 10 gold visas, with the requirement of creating at least 10 jobs.

In the first quarter of the year,

investments related to the gold visa scheme amounted to €293,894,642.10, or a 32 percent decrease compared to the €433,257,163.00 recorded in the same period of 2017. In cumulative terms - since gold visas began to be granted on 8 October, 2012, until March of this year - the total investment raised was €3,705,160,484.49, of which €347,687,174.20 were related to capital transfer and €3,357,473,310.29 for the purchase of real estate.

Since the creation of the scheme with a view to attracting investments 6,050 residence visas have been granted: two in 2012, 494 in 2013, 1,526 in 2014, 766 in 2015, 1,414 in 2016, 1,351 in 2017 and 497 in 2018. In cumulative terms, from its launch

until 5 March, 5,716 visas have been granted for property purchases, 324 for capital transfers, and 10 for the creation of at least 10 jobs. China leads the list of residency permits offered under ARI (3,771 until March), followed by Brazil (522), South Africa (242), Russia (211) and Turkey (188).

The new rules for obtaining 'gold visas,' which extended the investment criteria for citizens outside the European Union (EU) to areas such as urban rehabilitation and science, among others, came into force on 3 September 2015. Since 2013, 10,181 residence permits have been allocated to regrouped family members: 576 in 2013, 2,395 in 2014, 1,322 in 2015, 2,344 in 2016, 2,678 in 2017 and 866 in 2018.

# Algarve scientists saving storm-damaged corals and appealing for public's help

Researchers from the Algarve University's Centre for Marine Sciences (CCMAR) have been collecting decades-old coral from along the Algarve shoreline that washed up after being damaged during the ferocious storms, in a bid to transplant them back in their natural habitat.

he researchers are collecting a type of coral commonly referred to as gorgonians, "that were stranded on the shore following recent storms, in order to transplant them back to their natural habitat", the team explained in a statement. Researchers said that the storms of late have ripped a large amount of gorgonian corals from the rocky seabed, and these have been washing up on shore, particularly in the area of Santa Eulália beach in Albufeira. The species, mainly Leptogorgia sarmentosa and Leptogorgia lusitanica, were still alive when collected and are being kept and fed under controlled conditions at the marine biology station in Ramalhete, which is part of the Algarve University. In addition to these species, the researchers have also recovered a few specimens of Eunicella verrucosa, a gorgonian commonly known as "pink sea fan" among fishermen. The corals found had a wide array of sizes with the scientists estimating that some may be several decades old.

"These corals are extremely important to other species as their vertical and branching structure are analogous to trees in a forest, in which their threedimensional shape modifies the physical environment (e.g., ocean currents), thereby creating favourable conditions for other species", the researchers explained. "In addition to providing habitat, gorgonians also function as nesting sites for various organisms, including economically valuable species such as cuttlefish", they elaborated. The scientists are also collecting information on the locations from where the gorgonians broke off to document the highly destructive effects of storms on coral populations, as

well as for subsequent monitoring studies. There is an international online platform (www.marineforests.com), on which citizens are invited to give their contribution to the monitoring of marine forests of seaweeds and seagrasses (i.e. marine plants) by flagging the locations where these are observed. Researchers have now decided to expand that data collection to animal 'forests', including gorgonians, and are encouraging members of the public to get involved by uploading photos of corals and other marine organisms to this website, "whether they are found in the water, at low tide, or stranded on the beach outside the water".

# Algarve road users hand in petition

Users of the Algarve's EN125 road have handed in a petition to Parliament this week which calls for urgent repair work to be done on the stretch between Olhão and the Spanish border.

Local officials from affected towns and cities in the Eastern Algarve are demanding to know the state of contracts to improve the stretch of the road, which has been described as being "worthy of a Third World country."

### Hourly Portugal labour costs rise to €14.10, still 6th lowest in eurozone

Hourly labour costs in Portugal last year rose 3% to €14.10, but remained significantly below the European Union average as the sixth lowest in the eurozone, according to figures released this week by Eurostat, the EU's statistics office.

The data shows that in 2017 labour costs. excluding agriculture and public administration. averaged €26.80 an hour in the EU as a whole and €30.30 in the eurozone. The range of costs between different member states was very large, however, from €4.90 in Bulgaria to €42.50 in Denmark.

Portugal, despite its hourly labour costs rising 3% last year from €13.70 in 2016 - a rate of increase faster than both the EU average of 2.3% and the eurozone average of 1.9% - remains in the lower half

of the table.

Of the 11 EU member states with lower hourly costs - Malta (€13.80), Estonia (€11.70), Czech Republic (€11.30), Slovakia (€11.10), Croatia (€10.60), Poland (€9.40), Hungary (€9.10), Latvia (€8.10), Lithuania (€8), Romania (€6.30) and Bulgaria - just five are eurozone members.

The countries with the highest labour costs, after Denmark, are Belgium (€39.60), Luxembourg (€37.60), Sweets. and France (€36). TPN/Lusa (€37.60), Sweden (€36.60)



# Three Presidents Face Jail



Presidents and prime ministers who start wars still don't go to jail, but in democratic countries it is getting common to see presidents facing jail for corruption. In fact, we have had three since last Friday.

n South Korea, former President Park Geun-hye was sentenced to 24 years in prison and fined \$17 million on Friday for bribery, extortion, abuse of power and other offences. She is guilty as charged, but she is also a victim. On Saturday, former South African President Jacob Zuma appeared in a Durban court to face corruption charges over a \$2.5 billion arms deal, soon after his own party forced him to resign a year before his term ended. Since Zuma's former financial adviser has already served jail time on identical charges, his chances of a happy retirement seem rather slim.

And on Sunday former Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, universally known as 'Lula', began serving a 12-year jail term

for corruption. However, he's probably not guilty of anything that would justify his imprisonment. That's three gone or going in one weekend, and there are others in the queue - like former French President Nicolas Sarkozy, who faces charges that the late Libyan dictator Muammar Gaddafi illegally funded his 2007 presidential campaign. Running a country is clearly a high-risk job, and the people who get the job tend to be risk-takers. Not all of them are rich, and they are exposed to many temptations. Nevertheless, not all cases of corruption are about simple self-enrichment. Ex-president Park's was not, although she collected at least \$35 million in bribes from major Korean companies including Samsung and the giant retailer

Lotte. But Park Geun-hve was doing it all at the behest of her confidante. Choi Soon-sil. the daughter of a preacher and cult leader who won the trust of Park's father more than forty years ago. The ex-president's father, Park Chung-hee, ruled South Korea as a military dictator in the 1970s. When Park Geun-hye's parents were both assassinated, the orphaned girl was befriended by the preacher's daughter, Choi Soon-sil, who established comparative control over her. In 2013 Park Geun-hye was elected to the presidency, but Choi Soon-sil's influence never weakened. The bribes that Park received while in office almost all went to foundations controlled by Choi. Both women have gone to jail, and both deserved to, but Park , was as much a victim as a villain.

Jacob Zuma's is a simpler story. He was a major figure in the African National Congress during the decades of struggle against apartheid, first in prison on Robben Island and then in exile as the ANC's head of military intelligence. (His former chief of staff in that job once described him to me as a "military genius".) But Zuma had no money, and when he got political power in post-apartheid South Africa he set about to remedy that problem. There has never been any real doubt that he benefited enormously from the arms purchase deal, and he was forced to resign the deputy presidency in 2005 - but after he was elected as leader of the ANC in 2007 he managed to get the charges dropped. By 2009 he was the president of

South Africa, and for the next nine years the charges remained in abevance. When he was forced out of office two months ago for further brazen acts of corruption and for general economic mismanagement of the country, the charges were resurrected almost instantly, and now he faces a world of woe. About time. too, many would say. And Lula? There probably was no crime in the first place. Brazil is going through an enormous corruption scandal and more than half the members of Congress face charges, but so long as they control Congress and the

The crime he is charged with is

presidency they can probably

stave them off. An election is due in October, however, and Lula

would probably win it - if he were

petty by Brazilian standards: accepting free renovation work when his wife moved to a bigger holiday apartment in the seaside town of Guaraju. His judgement may have been clouded at the time, because he was fighting cancer, but in any case he was no longer in office and unable to do any political favours in return. He denies the whole thing, but at worst it was foolish to accept the help, not corrupt. Lula still lives in the industrial city of Sao Bernardo do Campo, 20 km from Sao Paulo, in a modest house within walking distance of the steelworkers union headquarters where I first interviewed him almost forty years ago. He is an honest man of simple tastes, but at the moment he is sitting in jail. He still has an appeal working its way up through the courts, but it's unlikely to set him free. The real reason he is in jail is to keep him from contesting the election, so there he will stay. The rule of law is an excellent

thing, but no system devised by human beings is invulnerable to manipulation by other human beings.

## **Bowls Algarve**

This week not much to report as most clubs have been kept busy playing against and entertaining visiting teams from the UK. A busy time but always an enjoyable time of year for all bowlers, as the games are always played with a great sense of fun. So we return to some hints and tips for bowlers.

### Movement of Bowls

When a bowl has been properly delivered by a player and, having run its course, comes to rest, it is said to be either Live or Dead. If it touches the jack during its course on the green it becomes a Toucher. A bowl which does not touch the jack is a non-Toucher.

To be a Live bowl and remain in play it must travel at least fourteen metres and be within the boundary of the rink. If a bowl becomes a Toucher it should be chalk marked and remains Live even if it lands in the ditch, provided it is still within the boundary of the rink. Bowls that pass outside the boundary of the rink, should be moved immediately, as should non-Toucher bowls that land in the ditch. Bowls which land entirely outside of the rink are dead, any part of the bowl remaining on the line are Live.

Players must take great care not to disturb live bowls until the end has been completed and points agreed and awarded.

# Blue passports for the UK

SIR, The UK government is considering giving the £490M contract for producing the new blue passports to Gemalto, a French company, rather than De La Rue, a British company, whose quote was £120M more over a 10 year period. De La Rue is currently challenging this through the Courts and a petition of nearly 300,000 signatures has been raised in the UK in support

Under EU law all contracts above a certain value have to be open to tender from all states unless there is an issue with National security. Quoting these issues, France, Germany, Spain. Italy, Netherlands and Ireland all produce their own passports without tendering being open to others. Not withstanding the potential security issues of a foreign country producing our new blue passports there seems to me to be a financial argument which skews the argument in favour of De La Rue. It is

reported that 200 jobs are at risk if the contract is lost to the UK; assuming that each of these workers is just on an average UK wage of slightly more than £26,000 p.a. then they will pay about £2,850 in income tax and £2,150 in NI contributions p.a. straight back to the government. Of course the whole of the rest of their wages remains in the UK and every time this money is spent the government creams off it's tax take. Assuming that De La Rue makes a profit on this contract then they will also have to pay corporation tax so where is the financial advantage of giving the contract to a French company? (As I write there are widespread strikes in France against the modernising policies of President Macron, wither our passports?).

# (and how 'not' to make a dog's dinner of it)



hat to feed our dogs; it's a huge subject and one on which just about everybody has a pretty strong opinion. It's no surprise, then, that the Canine Nutrition talk this month, hosted by Diane Lowe (Happy Feet -Dogs), and presented by Dra Ana Sanches (Clinica Veterinaria Vilamoura), turned into a very lively discussion.

As far as I was concerned, this session was long overdue. I've spent the last 12 months dabbling with alternatives to the processed dog foods that are abundantly available and so easy to fall back on. Like lots of devoted dog owners, I want to give my pooches the best chance of a long and healthy life and a huge part of that is what we feed them. But straying from the unconventional

path without guidance can be pretty scary. I am sure I am not the only person that thinks if I don't give them a perfectly balanced and 'prepared by experts' dog food, that I am not giving them the right nutrients. But, as Dra Ana reassured us, we don't think like that when we are preparing a meal for ourselves, do we? We don't measure out everything to the nth degree? We attempt to provide ourselves with a balanced diet over a period of time (with a few treats along the way). So why not take the same approach with our dogs? Dra Ana began the talk by stressing that this is not a 'war against kibble". There is a place for kibble. It contains many of the nutrients that our furry friends need. However, it also contains (like many processed foods intended

for humans) an alarming amount of sugar. So, if we can learn to look at the labels of what we are buying, just as we do with our own food, then we can. at the very least, attempt to redress the balance. There's a method of working out what the sugar content is. And the good news is you don't need a calculator! (See Happy Feet - Dogs Facebook page for the answer). But the bottom line is that, by replacing even some of the kibble with raw protein and calcium in the way of meat and bones; omega rich fish; eggs; oil and vitamin packed vegetables, to their weekly diet, we would make a huge difference to their health and well being. Sounds time consuming. And, naturally, it will take longer than opening a can or taking a pair of scissors to a pack of kibble. My own reaction was, do I really want to spend as long preparing my dog's food as I do my own? But, like most things in life, preparation is the key. Dra Ana had all sorts of tips for us, one of which was collecting the peelings and leftovers from our own vegetables and freezing them to add to our

what I need for the day and pile it on a plate. It doesn't stay there long. Is it more expensive? It needn't be. Butchers (and most supermarkets as I've recently discovered) cater for dogs with "mixed bags". but they are not for the faint hearted. That aside, we can buy certain meat extremely cheaply, and it's worth building up a relationship with the local butcher (especially if they don't have a fit dog of their own!). But it's not just about making our pets live longer. Diane Lowe, Happy Feet-Dogs knows a great deal about dog behaviour. According to her: "Too much sugar can lead to depression, anxiety, hyperor even aggressive behaviour as well as longterm health problems. Small changes that won't break the bank can make a huge difference". Clearly this is one aspect of how we can hope to give our pets a long and happy life. But to me it's a no brainer. Since the Canine Nutrition Talk, my elderly dog (who has symptoms of Old Dog Syndrome) has started to enjoy his mealtimes, had more energy and has generally seemed happier with life. I can't prove anything scientifically. But I genuinely think I have made a difference. We talk about "making a dog's dinner of something" and that signifies messing it up, somehow. I don't subscribe to that any more. I think if I can make a good "dog's dinner" I've had a successful day!

newborn turtles scurry towards the sea is magical. But choose your hatchery wisely, says Vicki Brown from Responsible Travel. Sea turtles have existed since the time of the dinosaurs, and have had millions of years to adapt to their environment. However, they have had just a few decades to come to terms with mass coastal development, plastic waste, light pollution, beach tourism and deep sea fishing, and unsurprisingly, their numbers have plummeted. Combine this with the poaching of adult turtles and their eggs for food, with their shells used to make highly valuable tortoiseshell, and it is no wonder that six of the seven species of sea turtle are now classified as vulnerable, endangered or critically endangered. Conservation organisations work around the globe to protect sea turtles, focusing on the beaches where they lay and hatch their eggs. Where nests are considered to be particularly at risk, the eggs may be transferred to a new part of the beach, known as a hatchery. Volunteering at or visiting a hatchery while on holiday certainly sounds like a worthy cause. However, online travel company Responsible Travel has investigated the ethics of hatcheries - and it turns out that not all are as beneficial to turtles as they may seem. Here are five

Do they use tanks?

Some hatcheries place the hatchlings in tanks for a couple of days in order to 'headstart' them, before releasing them once they are a little stronger. However, swimming can exhaust the hatchlings before they've reached the sea and food sources, and the tanks are breeding grounds for diseases and bacteria, which can then be transmitted to wild turtles. Worse still, some turtles are kept in tanks for weeks or even months, with tourists paying to hold them and take photos. Perhaps conservation is not the tanks' main purpose..

### Do they buy eggs from poachers?

# Can they prove they are successful?

Unless detailed records are kept about the number of nesting turtles, eggs and hatchlings, there is no real way to know if a hatchery is having a genuinely beneficial impact on sea turtle populations. Good intentions alone do not

to more eggs being dug up, as their value increases.

### Is there an expert on site?

Running a hatchery is far more complex than just burying eggs and releasing hatchlings. The incubation temperature affects the sex of the hatchlings; diseases can be transmitted if gloves are not worn; dry sand dehydrates eggs; compacted sand starves them of oxygen; moving the eggs too long after laying can rupture the membranes inside... in short, this is no business for amateurs. A qualified expert must oversee the hatchery.

### How else are they conserving turtles? Hatcheries should never

be the end goal of sea turtle conservation. The theft of eggs is one of the biggest threats to their survival, so working with local communities and schools to raise awareness is essential.

Coastal development must be deterred, light pollution reduced, tourists should be warned to avoid nests, and shorelines cleared of harmful plastic waste. And there are plenty of ways for people to contribute while on a volunteering holiday - such as carrying out beach patrols, monitoring nesting turtles and deterring predators from attacking hatchlings. If all these efforts paid off, of course, the hatchery wouldn't even be needed in the first place. And this is the real marker of a hatchery's success

arden designer and lecturer Hilary Thomas, who teaches garden and planting design online through Learning With Experts, explains: "Gardens are great places to be creative, as even small additions such as painting

the garden furniture, or the addition of colourful cushions, will have an instant and exciting effect." She offers five suggestions for giving your outdoor space a spring makeover.

Boost your boundaries During the cooler months,

we spend a lot of time looking at our gardens from the windows of the house, so take a long hard look at your garden and decide whether you like the

Walls and fences are the same height in a tiny garden as a large one, so

their importance increases as the size of the garden decreases. If all you can see are bare fences, spring is the time to do something about it.

Plant some structural evergreens at the back of the border so that as they mature, they will hide the boundary fence. Use plants like Elaeagnus x ebbingei, Osmanthus x burkwoodii. Phillyrea latifolia, Pittosporum tenuifolium and Viburnum tinus. Plant some clematis between these shrubs, and they will mix and mingle, creating a soft boundary around the garden with summer colour and allyear interest. If you look out at an unsightly concrete or brick wall, consider having it rendered and painted with

an exciting new shade of masonry paint. Think carefully about the colour and select a few climbing plants with flowers and foliage that will

complement the new wall.

With longer days and better weather on the horizon, now's the time to take a look at how your garden has fared over winter.

> Screen with green If your sitting area is overlooked by the nextdoor neighbour, consider planting a row of trees along the boundary to block out their view.

Think about how you

**use the garden**Consider the main use of the garden, and if it is primarily a space to sit, relax and entertain friends, consider digging up the lawn and enlarging the sitting area. Keep the paving simple and mix slabs with gravel or stone chippings to keep costs

### Revamp your garden furniture

If the garden furniture is looking a little tired and you don't want to buy new, put it in the garage or shed to dry off before rubbing it down and applying a coat of

Try to select a colour that will fit in with the colour of the planting around the sitting

area. There are paints suitable for both wood and metal furniture. Add some colourful cushions and tableware too.

### Perk up your patio with pots

Spice up your back and front garden with colourful, welcoming pots. Your front garden should offer a welcome to visitors, so try to have a selection of colourful pots near your front door.

Containers come in a variety of materials, but a group of terracotta or glazed pots will suit most situations. Make sure the pots you buy will be the right size once you get them home, because most people buy containers that are too small and out of scale with the house and

You can grow almost anything in a container; small trees, shrubs, herbaceous plants, bulbs and seasonal bedding.



# Small spaces – Big ideas

Feeling squeezed at home? Topology designers Athina Bluff and Amy Brandhorst share their top space-enhancing hacks with Gabrielle Fagan.

nterior designers and award-winning bloggers, Athena Bluff and Amy Brandhorst from Topology, have joined forces with Habitat, in a mission to help the nation maximise the space in their homes.

While there's nothing anyone can do about the bricks and mortar and actual dimensions of your property you live in, their seven home hacks could help you make the best of the space available, meaning rooms feel larger. Read on for their spaceenhancing secrets...

### Shine a light

"Ensure you have multiple light sources within a room to maximise light at night," says Bluff. "You should aim to have around six light sources around the room, which will 'replace' natural daylight and allow light to flow through the space. Enhance the effect with mirrored surfaces, which will bounce light around. Those and metallics, which reflect warm light, will create a sense of more space.

### Be free with flooring

"An easy trick for floors to is to continue the hallway flooring into your small room. Creating a visually unbroken flow of space will make it appear as though it's one big area, and creates an illusion that the floor is expanding," points out Bluff.

Create colour harmony "Try painting walls, skirting boards and door frames all the same colour. Painting them different colours can actually break up a space and emphasise the shape and (small) size of the room," says Brandhorst. "If they're all the same colour, they'll blend into one and make the room appear bigger."

### Make a great reflection

"Hang a mirror opposite a window. It's simple but extremely effective - both in terms of cost and visual impact," suggests Brandhorst. "The mirror will reflect natural light and instantly brighten up your space, as well as making it appear larger. If you're feeling creative, play around with different shapes or multiple mirrors to reflect as much light as possible. More light equals more sense of space."

### Choose multifunctional furniture

"Opt for dual usage furniture that can be folded or expanded to suit your needs," says Bluff. "If there's only two of you most evenings, opt for a folding table which, with an extension, turns into a four-person dining table for entertaining. Check out sofa bed options, which can easily turn a sitting room into a bedroom for guests. Always consider storage in items like

ottomans, pouffes, trunks, coffee tables. If there's a design that also hides clutter (the enemy of small spaces), choose it!"

### Embrace the dark side

"This is one for the brave!
Don't be afraid of going dark in small spaces," advises
Bluff. "It may sound counter-intuitive, but dark shades - navy and grey - can actually disguise the perimeters of a room and blur boundaries which extend the space, so don't feel you can only use 'Brilliant White' to achieve a sense of more space.
Walk on the dark side -

trust us, it works!"

### Work the walls

"As you don't have a lot of floor space to play with, think upwards and make use of walls instead," advises Brandhorst. "Floating shelves, clothes hooks, wall-mounted magazine racks and bike hooks will allow you to store things like folding chairs, or display belongings without cluttering the floor. Make use of dead space, such as corners, and have wall-mounted shelves."



# Time to get spinning

oraet boxina or weights, anyone who's ever sweated their way through a spin class will know they're one of the most exhilarating and endorphin-pumping experiences you can have at the gym.

This challenging workout format, which originated in New York and first became popular in the Nineties. uses a stationery bike with various resistance levels to challenge the rider's speed and endurance - often accompanied by pumping music, flashing lights and an enthusiastic instructor setting the pace! As well as building muscle and increasing cardio capacity, spin is a great way to shed fat; you can burn anywhere from 400-600 plus calories depending on the intensity and length of a

But if you're new to the spin world, it can seem a little intimidating at first. But you really don't have to be a procyclist to give it a go and reap the benefits. Here, Dan Little, head of fitness at boutique spinning studio Digme, shares his top tips for surviving - and nailing your first spin class...

### Get your bike set up correctly

Turning up to the spin class can feel like the first day of secondary school; you'll probably spot a couple of regulars who know exactly what they're doing, while you're scratching your head at the back. It's worth arriving 10 minutes early

up correctly, to make sure you're comfortable in the saddle and that you're not going to be pedalling towards injuries. If you're not sure, just ask the instructor to help. Little says: "Modern spin bikes are very easy to adjust, and the most important bit to get right is the height of the saddle. Stand next to the bike and feel on one side of your body for the top of your hip bone the saddle should be about level with it. When you sit on the saddle, it should feel comfortable and your legs should have a slight bend in the knee at the bottom of the pedal stroke. If you have to lock out your knees, the seat is probably a bit too high." Once the seat's in place, adjust the handlebars, ensuring they're not too close that your knees are rotating into them, and not so far away that you're overreaching.

### Get to grips with

cycling shoes
A lot of spin studios provide clip-in cleats; shoes with protrusions on the sole that attach to the pedals (but check beforehand whether this is the case - and it's usually totally fine to wear regular trainers). These may seem scary if you haven't used them before, but they are very simple to use. The trick is to slot in the front part of the cleat. then push down hard until you hear a pronounced click. To un-clip, simply push your heels out firmly to the side. As you are on a

static bike, there's also no danger of you getting stuck and falling off, as you might do on a road bike. Little says: "Being clipped in means you have a more efficient pedal stroke as you can pull up as well as push down. Your hamstrings and glutes therefore work harder than if you were cycling in trainers - trust me, this is a good thing!"

### Hydrate properly

Little advises making sure you take a bottle of water to the class with you. Even with air-con and fans, a spin class gets very sweaty, so you'll definitely want to have a drink handy.

Give yourself a break

Use the instructor's guidance on gear range and speed as a rough idea of how you should be performing. If you can't keep up, don't get disheartened. "Everyone is a beginner at some point, and there's no shame in not being able to match people in the room who are experienced riders," says Little. "Instructors are generally trained to give a wide range to cater for different levels of fitness, but even if that's too much, you can ease off a bit. If you need a break, take one. The beauty of spinning is that you're in complete control of how hard you work.'

### Don't death-grip the handlebars

It's natural to feel like you need to hold on tightly when you're going hell for leather, but this could lead to painful injuries. Keep

vour shoulders relaxed and focus on transferring power from your legs to the pedals to maximise your ride, says Little, and keep your grip loose so you can take the pressure off your wrists and elbows.

### Invest in some padded shorts

Specialist cycling shorts are not essential, but a little bit of light padding on the bum area won't go amiss, especially if you're not used to sitting on a saddle. You don't need to spend a fortune, but if you would prefer to wait until you have completed a session or two, you will be completely fine to take a class in a normal pair of leggings or shorts.

### Don't blow out in the first 10 minutes

As with any cardiovascular exercise, it's important to learn to pace yourself so you can endure a 45-minute class. Little says: "It's really important to ease into the session with a warm-up of about five minutes, which

prepares you for the session ahead. Don't be tempted to go off like a rocket - you will probably regret it and it will make the experience a lot less enjoyable if you are hanging on for the last 20 minutes.

### Enjoy it!

Spin classes are designed to be fun and exhilarating, so smile, enjoy the music, and get ready for the endorphin rush when you reach the finish line.

# What no one tells you..

Claire Farrington shares some of the amazing things she's learned since the birth of her son Theo.



Raising a child with Down's Syndrome can be unpredictable but, above all, hugely rewarding and life-affirming, says Claire Farrington, 41. Two years ago, she and her partner Andrew Papadimitriou welcomed their son Theo into the world 11 weeks premature, and three weeks later, they discovered he had the genetic condition.

Here, the mother-of-one from London, who writes the blog Mum On a Different Path (mumonadifferentpath. wordpress.com), shares some of the things she's learned over the last two years.

### 1. It's important to take it day by day

When I envisioned my family vears before we three were a

reality, I didn't give one thought to the number of chromosomes we'd have. Down's Syndrome was a world far away from meobscured and shrouded by outof-date assumptions. But when the future be-

comes totally unknown, just as it did when Theo was diagnosed, you fear it. What really threw me at the beginning was not knowing what life could be like for my son. Suddenly I had so many questions about what I had blithely taken for granted. Would he walk, talk, be independent, get married, travel, have a job?

But why did I have to try to see the future for someone who was only weeks old? Do we know all the answers with a

typical child? Of course not. Life never comes with guarantees.

I can honestly say the last 24 months of being Theo's mum have been the best and the most enriching of times. Just as the future can be daunting due to the unfamiliarity, the future can be incredible, too, for exactly the same reason.

### 2. Not everything is linked to Down's Syndrome

At the beginning, Down's Syndrome was the first thing I thought about as soon as I woke up. I churned it over in my mind constantly. I hadn't yet learned that his condition was only a small part of my son.

At first, I would attribute all of Theo's behaviour, health, habits and actions to the condi-

tion. If he got a little sick, it was Down's Syndrome. If he refused new food: Down's Syndrome. Equally, his easy-going nature and distinct lack of screaming: Down's Syndrome.

He was the most sociable child in the nursery, but was that the Down's Syndrome? No, actually. It was Theo.

It's really important to rememberthat the personality you see developing infront of your eyes is unique and made up from a sum of many different parts. Yes, Theo wouldn't be Theo without his extra chromosome, but he wouldn't be Theo without everything else in his life either.

### 3. The ordinary can be amazing

I can now leave Theo with a pot of yogurtand a spoon and it all goes in, mostly. And I'm amazed-it's a real achievement for a little boy, not only born at 29 weeks, but born with low muscle tone. Most physical activities will take much longer for Theo, so I loveawiningross-motorskills.

I was also ridiculously happy seeing my son learn his first bit of sign language. Being a mum of a child with Down's Syndrome grounds you like nothing else. You're given a gratefulness for

the straightforward, everyday stuff that you would normally just expect to happen. When it finally it does, it's pure gold dust. Like Theo's breathing (once

heavily assisted by a machine), his eating and drinking (he was tube-fed for months and we were told to expect issues but we've had none), his overall health and strength (as a premature baby this was never a given). Every single time I hold him, I'm just so thankful he's here.

### 4. You inherit an armour

After the tsunami of grief, tears and fear, you emerge stronger, with a stoic appreciation for any family who've had to deal with uncertainty over their child's health. And you're ready to fight your corner so the world sees your son or daughter as just as worthy as the next.

Some days it doesn't feel like a fight, but on the days it does, you find a strength you didn't think you had. Never before did Ifeel so galvanised and so ready to speak up. All parents of a child with Down's Syndrome are advocates - which is quite a journey from the initial slew of feelings the diagnosis brings.

You realise you'll have to work a bit harder for school places than parents of typical children. But it's doable, not insurmountable. You'll soon be a veteran at fielding the surprisingly kaleidoscopic range of  $responses\,to\,the\,news\,that$ your child has Down's Syndrome (I've heard some unintentional shockers).

### 5. You gain a new

I have found blogs-a-plenty, Instagram accounts in their thousands, videos, shared advice, a camaraderie and a virtual community in which we felt at home and supported.

At the beginning, you'll probably be the only one in the hospital that day, or even month, who hears the news, 'I'm sorry to tell you your baby has a chromosomal abnormality known as trisomy-21'. It's isolating and frightening, but you'll take enormous comfort from all the future references you'll see of families simply getting on with life. In the stark light of day, it really is OK.

I consumed everything I

found online - parents expressing their pride, their love and, ves. their frustrations with their children. Soon I was sharing tips and the long-awaited achievements with an incredible congregation of parents. 6. Your child will shift

perceptions all by themselves I remember browsing shops in the early days and passersby would linger a little longer. I was always hyper-aware of the looks we'd get. Now, I don't mind at all. In fact, I've come to believe it's rather a privilege. If we're in a restaurant, Theo will make everyone around him smile. We've made so many lovely dinner companions and bus buddies, and all the time, I know Theo is ever so slightly altering perceptions. We, as his parents, just sit back and watch him make the world around us an even better place to live. Our children have an innate ability to draw out the good stuff deep within people, and it's an honour to witness it. You'll be a different person

Post Theo, I have naturally re-evaluated everything and it's completely reshaped me. Yes, it sounds corny, but I know I'm a better person because of my son and his Down's Syndrome. The important stuff comes into focus and everything that's insignificant drifts away. I suppose it's a painful enlightenment at first. but what remains, after the backwaters of grief have subsided, is a startling clarity.

And it's not just your immediate family's life that feels this positive force, it extends far and wide. And your child is at the epicentre. Which is pretty amazing, really. amazing, really.

## Master Class

This year's Masters had a little something for everybody, as well as treating the viewers to one of the most intriguing final rounds, for the last few years.



t the Academy I get asked who am I liking for the tournament, who would I have a flutter on. My normal response when it comes to the Masters is look for a past winner, they are the most likely to be able to cope with the unique atmosphere and pressure throughout the tournament, and especially on the back nine, final day. So when we were sat tight with the final few holes ahead, one glance at the leader board really only confirmed my thoughts that coaches should stick to what they are good at, that being coaching. Although what Spieth was putting together really was capturing the imagination, turning at five under and then adding four more to the tally, leaving him an opportunity to post a score which would set the hearts racing. Unfortunately a bogey on the last just left him a touch short of the mark. Rickie Fowler's clutch birdie on the last gave Reid a target, he needed to par the last two to win. Very manageable and yet very easy to mess up. So when he left the five footer up the

hill on the last, he showed why the media call him 'Captain America', he held his nerve and closed the deal.

Reed being called Captain America is a far shout from the names he has been called over the past five years. He has often been described as brash and arrogant; some have alluded to his College career, where at best he has been described as a loner, at the worst a thief or even a cheat. The brashness comes from his belief. When asked what did he see in his future, he believed he was a top five world player; this before any Ryder Cup or Major success. The press appeared to want a villain in the piece and Reed certainly seemed to fit the bill.

The unfairness is quite startling. If you were to ask any, and I do mean any quality young player, whether they believe that they can achieve, they will answer 'yes'. Do they mean it, is another matter.

Otherwise why put in all of the hard work and sacrifice if you don't think that you can do it.

The tide of public opinion started to move in his favour when he took on

Rory in the opening match of the Hazeltine Ryder cup singles. This was a match of the ages, finger wagging at each other, the "I can't hear you!" being shouted by Rory but Reed winning on the last gained the respect of the wider golfing public as well as his peers. The kid can play and play hard when it matters. He has Rory's number now too.

That opening singles win promoted him to the position of "Captain America". Now holding the position of Number 11 in the World, perhaps the belief of being a World top five player is realistic. What should be remembered is when I was realising that the "bet on a past winner" was a mile away, it was

then, whilst looking at the leaderboard, the pedigree of the players chasing him was apparent. All seven of the top seven in the world were on his heels and closing in. It almost seemed that when Spieth fell short, Fowler picked up the baton and tried to catch him. Yet he prevailed. What now for Reed, well if winning a Ryder Cup singles match changes

public opinion for the better, he now has a Green jacket and the respect of the top, top players in the world. Certainly there is a Ryder Cup in his future later on this year, who knows even a rematch between Reed and Rory is on the cards.

If he was confident then, he now knows he is a great player. This level of confidence will, you would imagine, only carry him to greater heights. Maybe more Majors to follow this year?

But as a footnote to the piece, spare a thought for Sergio. Tiger stole the preshow story from Sergio and the only time 'El Nino' really got into the papers was by making a thirteen on fifteen. The Press are now calling him the 'Water boy'. Time waits for no man.

## Benfica and FC Porto battle for title as Sporting implode

ast weekend the top three in the Primeira Liga -Benfica, FC Porto and Sporting - all won whilst fourth-placed SC Braga could only draw at Feirense.

SC Portimonense picked up another valuable point at Tondela.

What should have been a comfortable away win for Benfica at Vitória de Setúbal proved to be anything but. The Eagles were dealt a blow before kick-off with the news that their goalscoring talisman Jonas had picked up an injury in the warm-up and would not be risked ahead of the title clash against Porto.

The problems mounted for Benfica as Setúbal took an early lead through Costinha with a back-post

volley into the far corner. Jiménez levelled matters in the twenty-eighth minute, reading the trajectory of Rafa Silva's cross to tap in at the farpost.

Edinho could have reclaimed the home side's lead fifteen minutes after the break, but struck Nuno Pinto's cutback high and wide. Just as it looked like Benfica would have to settle for a draw they were given the chance to secure all-three points.

Two minutes into stoppage time Luís Felipe grabbed Salvio's shirt and Jiménez made no mistake from the penalty spot to keep Benfica at the summit of the table. Only a win would suffice for Porto as they welcomed relegation candidates Desportivo Aves to the Estádio do Dragão.

A clear foul on Ricardo Pereira inside the area gave the home side the ideal start as Alex Telles converted from the penalty spot after seven minutes. That advantage was soon doubled in the tenth minute with a freak effort from Otávio as he blocked a clearance from the edge of the box. The ball rebounded into the bottomleft corner of the goal past a bemused Aves keeper

Adriano Fachini who, in the second-half stood between Porto and goal number three. The Brazilian keeper was in outstanding form as he performed heroics to keep the score at 2-0 come fulltime.

Following Sporting's 2-0 defeat at Atletico Madrid in the first-leg of their Europa League quarter-final, president Bruno de Carvalho could not contain his annoyance at the result.

He posted a message on Facebook lambasting Coates and Mathieu for their mistakes, Gelson Martins for failing to take his chance when clean through, and Fábio Coentrão and Bas Dost for collecting yellow cards that rule them out of the second leg.

Back in Lisbon, the atmosphere among the squad was evidently tense, although the club denied rumours the first-team squad had refused to train. The players shared a text on Instagram expressing their disapproval of the public criticism and "the absence of support from he who should be our leader."

Among the group who posted the message were practically all of Sporting's most important players, such as Rui Patrício, William Carvalho, fellow Portugal internationals Fábio Coentrão, Bruno Fernandes and Gelson Martins together with experienced senior players Bryan Ruiz, Coates and Montero.

Despite the rumours of wholesale changes, Sporting manager Jorge Jesus called on a large portion of big names to take on P.Ferreira at the Alvalade.

William Carvalho and Fábio Coentrão were out injured, while Cristiano Piccini was suspended. Bas Dost opened the scoring after twenty minutes when he nodded home Bruno Fernandes' flick-on.

Sporting secured their 2-0 win through Bryan Ruiz converting Gelson Martins cross in the sixty-fifth minute. Sporting's win sees them pull three points clear of fourth-placed SC Braga, who succumbed to a late Feirense goal to draw 2-2.

How the public spat between the President and players will be resolved is anyone's guess; it appears just one more spectacular example of the club's ability to shoot itself in the foot.
