Algarve oil drilling wins BRENDAN DE 'biggest waste of EU taxpayer's money award

This week, Portugal's government has won gold in the 2018 European Fossil Fuel Subsidies Awards, for the biggest waste of taxpayers' money on supporting dirty energy.

he second edition of a unique contest organised by Climate Action Network (CAN) Europe was won by Portugal for handing out a licence to national gas and oil companies for drilling in the deep sea in the southwest of the country.

Portugal was said to have been the clear winner of gold in the 2018 European Fossil Fuel Subsidies Awards. The winners are governments who waste taxpayers' money on supporting dirty energy. Poland comes second and Spain third.

A Europe-wide digital campaign in March triggered people across Europe to vote for the three worst fossil fuel subsidies out of eight nominees in total.

The aim of the awards, set up by CAN Europe, is according to the organisation, "to expose the wellhidden ways in which European governments are using taxpayers' money to support fossil fuels at the cost of the

climate, the environment and people's health, and increase the pressure to rapidly phase out fossil fuel subsidies.

It said Portugal cruised to gold for handing out a license to national gas and oil companies for drilling in the deep sea in the Southern province of Alentejo, a protected biodiversity area and a tourism hotspot.


The European Union (EU) itself was awarded a special prize by CAN Europe for its support for gas infrastructure. In 2014-2016, the EU provided an average of €4bn spending on fossil fuels, most of which went to gas projects such as the Trans-Adriatic and Trans-Anatolian pipelines (TAP and TANAP). Wendel Trio, director of CAN Europe, said: "Two years on from adopting the Paris Agreement, it is unacceptable to be pouring billions of public money into fossil fuels. It causes damage to people's health, the climate, and makes no sense economically

The awards send a clear signal to European governments: now is the time to phase out fossil fuel subsidies. The freed resources will be useful to enhance a clean and fair energy transition in Furone.

"The EU also needs to demonstrate through the negotiations on the EU budget that there is no place for fossil fuels in EU funds. Instead, public finance should deliver higher climate ambition.' Following this news, Francisco Ferreira, director of Zero in Portugal added: "It is unacceptable that the

Portuguese government favours access to oil drilling companies on the coast, while the country has a leading role on pledging for ambitious climate action and is planning to become carbon neutral by 2050."

Climate Action Network (CAN) Europe is Europe's largest coalition working on climate and energy issues and boasts over 140 member organisations in more than 30 Furopean countries - representing over 44 million citizens.

This news comes days after a protest was staged in Lisbon last Saturday against prospecting for oil off the Algarve coast. Over one thousand people took part in the protest to raise awareness about the dangers of accidents

relating to prospecting. The protest was called by a platform that unites 32 of the country's main national and local environmental defence organisations, civic movements, councils and political parties

News in Brief

Ryanair and TAP could be asked to pay out €7m

Ryanair and TAP Air Portugal could be forced to pay out around seven million euros to passengers following the Easter airline strikes. AirHelp, which deals with compensation claims for passengers affected by delays and cancellations, estimates that the national flag carrier TAP could be asked to fork out around 5.2 million euros in claims. It said Ryanair could also suffer, and be asked to pay out just under two million euros because of stoppages which occurred over three days

Extreme winds cause €100,000 damage in Albufeira

The damage caused by the high winds in Albufeira during the early hours of last Friday morning has been estimated at over €100,000. Eleven cars were damaged in the freak weather, as were awnings and metal structures. It was the third incident involving extreme winds in the Algarve in a little over a month. Damage was also caused by the blustery weather in Portimão, Quarteira and Santa Barbara de Nexe.

More speed cameras in pipeline for

A number of new speed cameras could soon be fitted in and around Lisbon. According to reports, Lisbon Council is looking at fitting another 120 speed cameras on top of the 21 cameras already in operation. Some of the new equipment is to be fitted to traffic lights. The exact locations have not yet been revealed. Double-parking will also be monitored.

Algarve University researcher in pioneering project

A researcher from the Algarve University is taking part in a pioneering study being conducted in the US to establish a link between the intestines and the development of diseases such as diabetes. Leonor Faleiro is conducting the ground-breaking research in partnerships with the University of Florida. It came after the scientist noted that children who developed such diseases had an imbalance of intestinal protein

A man died over the weekend at the Colombo Shopping centre in Lisbon, after falling from the second floor. 
Smart roads to end fatalities

This week, plans were detailed as to how Portugal is aiming to drastically cut fatalities on the nation's roads and slash fuel emissions through the application of a network of intelligent roads by 2050. In order to achieve these ambitious goals, Portugal will initially be investing 8.35 million euros over the next two years to have a selection of vehicles connected to the ground-breaking technology. Hopes are first vehicles operating under the system will be taking to the roads during the course of next year.

he project, developed by C-Roads and cofunded by the European Union, will be installed on just under 1,000 kilometres of Portuguese roads.

Road Safety Director of Infraestruturas de Portugal (IP) Ana Tomaz, was on Thursday quoted as telling DN/Dinheiro Vivo that "more than 90 percent of all accidents are the result of human error and the aim to is minimise the consequences of these mistakes. We have to invest in a new generation of roads in order to gradually reduce the number of fatalities to zero by the year 2050. C-Roads Portugal consists in the deployment of five intelligent transport system pilot cases, covering relevant sections of the core network and comprehensive network and of its two urban nodes. The project will cover major routes, including the Lisbon-Algarve A2 motorway, the Algarve's

A22 and the urban areas of

Lisbon and Porto.

According to C-Roads, these systems will encompass a group of technologies and applications that allow effective data exchange through wireless communication technologies between components and parties of the transport system, very often between vehicles or between vehicles and infrastructure.

Once the system has been successfully implemented in Portugal, services will run along 964 kilometres. In total 212 roadside units will be installed in addition to 180 on-board units fitted to 162 vehicles in operation. C-Roads, in addition to Portugal, will also operate in 16 other EU member states. According to the organisation, the deployment of the system is an evolutionary process that will start with the less

complex use cases. These are referred to as "Day-1services", encompassing messages about traffic jams, hazardous locations, road-works and slow or stationary vehicles, as well as weather information and speed advice to harmonise traffic. Using probe vehicle and infrastructure-related data, "all services will be transmitted directly into the vehicles in a way that allows users to be informed, but not distracted."

The technology comes at a time when the number of cars on national roads continues to climb strongly, resulting in greater traffic congestion and fuel emissions. It is estimated that there will be around 6.5 million cars in Portugal by the year 2022, which is 12 percent on the figure for 2015. There are also concerns that the recent

upswing in road fatalities, following decades of successive drops, can also be explained to this increase in road users. In the meantime, the first step here in Portugal will be the creation of a smartphone application that will enable the sharing of information between motorists and the intelligent transport systems, followed by tests which are initially set to cover around 460 kilometres of the national road network. While this new technology has received the backing of both Brussels and Lisbon. C-Roads concede that several stumbling blocks remain unresolved including legal, organisational and administrative issues as well as implementation and procurement issues.

Douro River attracts record 1.2 million tourists in 2017

The navigable section of the Douro River in 2017 saw record passenger traffic totalling about 1.2 million tourists on the boats that travel along the river, the River's management authority said on Tuesday.

he Port Authority of Douro. Leixões and Viana do Castelo (APDL) reported in a statement that the 35 percent growth over 2016 "exceeds all expectations." The APDL had expected to end the year with 1 million passengers.

Since 2015, the year in which the management of the Douro was passed to the APDL, passenger transport in this channel has registered "an increase of 78 percent, or 560,999 tourists."

The port authority said it wants to continue "boosting maritime and river passenger traffic" and expects that by 2019, it will exceed the 1.3 million barrier. According to the APDL, freight transport also registered a huge increase in 2017, with about 52,000 tons of cargo handled, which represents an increase of 66 percent over the previous year. The main resource transported on the Douro Navigation Channel was granite from the commercial ports of Várzea and Sardoura,

mainly for export to the Netherlands, Germany and Sweden.

Last year, 149 vessels of 61 operators travelled on the Douro, with tourists coming mainly from the United Kingdom, Germany and France, who chose to travel on small vessels, day cruises or hotel boats, and for programmes that range from one hour to one week. The Douro Navigation Channel, which runs from Barca de Alva to Porto, opened fully in 1990.

Lisbon pads its pouch with over €18m in tourist tax

The €1 a night per quest tourist tax charged in Lisbon's hotels has reaped the city €18.5 million from 2016 to 2017, which was up €6.1 million on the 12 months before, and is also a reflection of the growing tourism in the capital.

Last year was the first year that all parties involved - hotels and local accommodation - charged the tax.

Lisbon councillor for Finance, João Paulo Saraiva, who presented the results in the 2017 Accounts Report this week, said the €18.5 million garnered was also significantly more than what had been predicted by the council for the year, set at €15.7 million.

The Municipal Tourist Tax was approved in 2014 and started to be applied in 2016 to all national and foreign visitors overnighting at hotels and local accommodation in the city, for up to a maximum of seven nights per stay.

An agreement between the PS and the Left Bloc foresees hiking the tax at some point, but the Finance Councillor said it is "completely premature to move forward with a rise" imminently, but he would have news on the matter "towards the middle of this year."

"Several issues are being considered in this equation, the main one being the safeguarding of the city's structural revenue", explained

João Paulo Saraiva, recalling that Lisbon is experiencing an "extraordinary situation" in terms of tourism, which could change from one moment to the next.

It is necessary that the council "takes care with the structural revenue of the municipality, to accommodate the structural expenditure", should revenue "associated with the pick-up of real estate and the dynamics of the city" decrease, the councillor warned.

About the possibility of extending the rate to the arrivals by air and sea, which is foreseen in the proposal of the Municipal Tourist Tax but which has not vet come into force, João Paulo Saraiva explained that the topic is being addressed.

"When we have the solution we will get back to it", he said, explaining that there are operational difficulties in setting up the system", but the idea "has not been abandoned.'

"Some solutions are being considered" that could be put into practice, "if not this year, at the beginning of next year", he elaborated.

Porto, Gaia announce construction of seventh bridge

The councils of Porto and Vila Nova de Gaia have announced the construction of a new bridge over the Douro River, a project that will be entirely funded by the two cities.

The new 250-metre crossing, to be called D. António Francisco dos Santos Bridge after the bishop who died last year, will be the seventh bridge between the

The mayors of the two cities estimate it will cost about €12 million and be completed in three to four years.

Study finds red wine and forest fruits could prevent

mental illness

Researchers at the Centre for Research in Health Technologies and Services (Cintesis) in the northern Portuguese city of Porto have found that substances in red fruits and red wine improve intestinal flora, reduce inflammation and may contribute to the prevention of depression and neurodegenerative diseases.

Regular consumption of red fruits or red wine may play an important role in regulating the intestinal microbiota, reducing inflammation, preventing depression, and combating dementia and other neurodeaenerative diseases through the presence of a particular class of compounds in these foods (anthocyanins)", the study, released on Tuesday, concluded. Led by Conceição Calhau, a researcher at Cintesis and professor at Nova Medical School, the team conducted a series of studies to evaluate the

relationship between the type of diet, the composition of intestinal microbiota, that is, the set of microbes that inhabit the intestine, and the brain itself. Scientists found that in animals, a diet rich in saturated fat negatively alters the composition of the intestinal microbiota and leads to inflammation in the brain. In animals it was found that the continuous intake of blackberry extract rich in anthocyanins is able to improve the intestinal microbiota and reduce the inflammation in the brain that underlies the neurological complications

associated with obesity. In humans, a clinical trial also compared the impact of a blackberry 'purée' when ingested in the presence or absence of alcohol.

"The results suggest that the consumption of blackberry 'puree' with alcohol increases the levels of anthocyanins in the blood. However, further studies are needed to see if overweight or obese individuals can effectively benefit from the consumption of foods containing both anthocyanins and alcohol, as is the case with red wine", researchers explained.





World Health Summit held in Coimbra

Coimbra's São Francisco Convent has this week hosted the yearly World Health Summit. The event took place on Thursday and Friday, and brought several hundred health experts from around the world to central Portugal.

rganised by Coimbra University and Coimbra University Hospital, the main topic to be discussed at this year's gathering was global health in Africa.

According to the organisers, the meeting was seen as "an opportunity to deepen ties with Portuguese-speaking African countries and the affirmation of Portuguese

health in a world context." "It is a moment of affirmation for Coimbra to the world, because it is the first time that these summits have focussed so greatly on Africa. Therefore, the strategic

dimension of Portugal in this connection between Europe and Africa is assumed completely by Coimbra", said João Gabriel Silva, head of the UC. In the academic's view, the summit opens the possibility for Portugal "to play a relevant role in the discussion on global health", besides representing, "for Coimbra, for the region and for the University, an important step in the path of internationalisation that has been building. Emphasising the work of "several years" to reach this stage, the president of CHUC, Fernando Regateiro, stressed that the realisation of this summit "opens paths that help design the institution across borders and its image in the country itself". "In choosing the themes for this meeting, we had a great competitive advantage in our proposal, which was profound knowledge, intense relationship and proximity to the people of Africa, particularly Portuguesespeakers", he said.

National drug company looks to double team of researchers

Portuguese drug company Bial wants to double its current team of 104 researchers over the coming years, to ensure the development of new projects that enable it to keep invoicing going up by double digits.

Speaking to reporters at the inauguration of the works to expand and renovate its Research & Development centre in Trofa, near Porto, Bial CEO António Portela said that 25 of the 100 or so new scientists they want to hire will be recruited this year and in 2019.

He told the reporters that the aim of the new R&D team was to ensure innovation and the speed of developing new projects that guarantee the company keeps growing in double digits in terms of invoicina.

Bial's revenue increased 17 percent in 2017 to €270 million.



Portugal among Mediterranean countries with most sustainable practices in tourism

A study by the Algarve School for Hospitality and Tourism (ESGHT) has found that Portugal is one of the Mediterranean countries with the greatest number of businesses that implement measures for sustainable tourism.

he study found that 83 percent of all businesses within the tourism industry implement to some extent practices of sustainability. This figure makes Portugal one of the Mediterranean countries that have the most companies with sustainable practices in the tourism sector. According to the study, only 17 percent of tourismgeared companies said

they do not implement any type of sustainable practices in their business operations. Conducted within the framework of the ShapeTourism project, 'New shapes and drivers for the tourism sector: supporting decisions, integrating plans and ensuring sustainability', the ESGHT's study concluded the countries where companies implement the fewest sustainable

practices are Cyprus, Croatia, Italy and France. This study involved a transnational survey of nearly 500 public and private tourism stakeholders from a population of more than 9,000 stakeholders from nine countries across the Mediterranean region. It further established that the three practices incorporated most by Portuguese tourism companies are to recruit and hire local people (68 percent), preserving cultural and historical identity (63 percent) and promoting energy efficiency (59 percent). On the other hand, the three practices that are not implemented as frequently as they could be are: limiting the access of visitors to highly-sensitive cultural and historical resources (41 percent); donating funds or services and goods to green

All your computer questions answered

What is Powerline networking?

A Powerline network is essentially a wired network with (mostly) hidden wires. Let's say that you have your broadband router in the hallway and a smart Samsung HD TV in the living room. Let's also say that this particular television isn't wireless-enabled, so the only way that you can enjoy catch-up TV on it is to trail an Ethernet cable from the router, down the hallway, and across the living room floor to the TV. You try to hide the cable under a large carpet. It doesn't work.

The Powerline solution is less visible – a 'no new wires' approach. You buy a basic kit, which comes with two Powerline adapters and two short Ethernet cables. Portugal's airports handle over 10 million passengers during first quarter of year

Over 10 million passengers passed through Portugal's airports between January and March 2018.

he 10 airports in Portugal managed by Vinci handled 10.4 million passengers in the first three months of the year, which is up 12 percent on the same period in 2017, the company said.

Vinci said this reflected the good performance by the five main Airlines

that operate in Portugal, all of which had double-digit growth rates.

Lisbon registered the biggest growth of all airports, having processed over half of the ten million passengers registered between January and March. The capital's airport saw a 15.9

The capital's airport saw a 15.9 percent increase in passengers to 6 million, while Porto increased 12

percent to 2.38 million passengers. In Faro, the bankruptcies of Monarch and Air Berlin in 2017 meant passenger numbers remained stable. Overall Portuguese airports represented a quarter of all passengers who passed through airports belonging to French group Vinci during that period.

Cracked cockpit window forces easyJet flight to divert to Paris

An easyJet flight from Lisbon to Luxembourg had to make an emergency landing in Paris on Sunday afternoon after the cockpit window shattered.

The aircraft had departed Lisbon at just after 6pm, an hour and a half behind schedule.

The plane was only half hour from landing in Luxembourg when the incident happened, but the pilot opted to land at Charles de Gaulle airport in Paris as a safety precaution.

According to reports, the pilot kept passengers

informed of what was happening, but "initially said the diversion was due to a technical problem with the onboard computer" newspaper *Diário de Notícias* said.

A replacement aircraft was dispatched to collect the affected passengers and complete the flight to Luxembourg, and make the return leg from Luxembourg back to Lisbon.

Portugal third cheapest for UK holidaymakers

Holidaymakers seeking the cheapest beach holidays this summer should avoid the eurozone, with the exception of destinations such as the Algarve, according to new research.

The pound stretches furthest in Sunny Beach, Bulgaria, analysis of 18 popular European destinations by Post Office Travel Money revealed.

The cost of a basket of tourist staples such as meals, drinks, sun cream and insect repellent in the Black Sea resort was found to be less than half the price of that in two-thirds of the locations surveyed.

Two people can have an evening meal with wine in Sunny Beach for around £26, and lunch for under £9.

Mediterranean resort town Marmaris took the runner-up spot in the study due to the plummeting Turkish lira, down 25% year-on-year compared with sterling. The Algarve, despite the strengthening pound, came in third.

The most expensive beach destination was found to be Sorrento, Italy, where evening meals typically cost around £64, with lunch setting visitors back £32.

Andrew Brown, of Post Office Travel Money, said: "The cost of eating out is always a big consideration for holidaymakers and we found that meal costs in Sunny Beach and Marmaris are significantly lower than in any of the eurozone resorts surveyed.

"On a week's holiday, the cost of lunch and dinner ranges from £243 in Sunny Beach and £287 in Marmaris to well over twice as much in Sorrento.

"That's why it will pay to do your homework before booking, to find a resort that fits your budget."

Poor sleep habits increase obesity risk in boys,

study finds Boys with poor sleep habits have a "very high risk of obesity", according to a study by researchers at the Faculty of Science and Technology of the University of Coimbra (FCTUC).

ased on the recommendations of the American Academy of Pediatrics (2016), which established adequate sleep to be between nine and 12 hours a night for children aged 6

to 12, the research aimed to analyse "the relationship between irregular sleeping habits", (more or less time than recommended) and "the risk of obesity in the Portuguese paediatric population".

The researchers studied the sleep habits of 8,273 children (4,183 females) between the ages of six and nine, as well as "physical activity and sedentary behaviours (e.g. time spent watching television or playing

computer games), through questionnaires completed by the parents", said the University of Coimbra (UC), in a statement sent to Lusa News Agency on Monday. The relationship between sleep habits and the risk of obesity for boys and girls were calculated separately. The results, published in

the American Journal of Human Biology, show that "boys who had irregular sleep habits for their age, that is, either below 9 hours/night or more than 12 hours/night, during the week, are 128 percent more likely to be classified as overweight compared to those who slept for the recommended time", said researcher Aristides Machado-Rodrigues. Interestingly, but similar to the results of some previous studies, among girls, "there were no significant associations between sleep duration and risk of obesity, either on weekdays or during the weekend", said the CIAS investigator, quoted by the

But, argues Machado-Rodrigues, "compliance with recommended sleep habits in childhood" is "a crucial aspect of cognitive health and the harmonious development of children". Obesity is considered one of the epidemics of the 21st century due to the fact that it is associated with numerous cardiovascular diseases, especially metabolic and cardiovascular diseases. Machado-Rodrigues points out "its multifactorial etiology", referring to "the existence of a broad set of variables. biological, genetic, social and behavioural, that

contribute decisively to the fact that an individual may suffer from increased adiposity compared to the standard pattern". In recent years, epidemiological studies have reported that irregular sleep duration may be an additional risk factor for obesity among children. The UĆ concluded, "sleeping habits are those that have been the focus of least attention compared to other daily behaviours, such as physical activity. nutritional habits or even sedentary lifestyle".

Parliament approves gender change on official ID from age 16

The Portuguese parliament has approved a bill allowing gender to be changed on official identification documents from the age of 16, without requiring a medical report.

The vote was applauded in the session by some MPs and by citizens attending in the galleries. According to a count by Parliament, 109 votes were in favour compared to 106

The decision has however encountered strong criticism from the Catholic Church which has asked President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa to exercise his veto rights over the legislation.

The first semi-final is being held on Tuesday 8 May, the second on Thursday 10 May, and the grand finale is on Saturday 12 May.

As well as reminding visitors to Portugal to ensure their passports are valid for the duration of the stay, the Embassy stressed Portugal will be imposing "tighter border controls on all travellers during the event", and advised "allow extra time to transit passport control at airports, seaports and border crossings."

It also advised EU visitors to "remember to bring your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) but also take out travel insurance; even if you're only going for one night, it could save you a lot of money if you get into difficulties."

The note also revealed that

body and bag searches will be carried out at entry points to the Altice Arena, and listed a series of prohibited items, which include "selfie sticks, laptops, cameras, sound recorders, spray cans, lighters, lanterns, lasers, alcohol, backpacks and large bags, food, liquids, can and glass bottles, trolleys, umbrellas, helmets, chairs, fireworks and flares", among other items. Entrance to the Eurovision 'Village', set up in Terreiro do Paço, will also be controlled by police who will carry out body and bag searches at the entry point. Portugal with lowest CO² emissions for new cars

Portugal is the EU member state which boasts the lowest levels of carbon dioxide emissions from new passenger cars.

According to a study published by the European Environment Agency, new cars in Portugal had the lowest CO² emissions with 105 grams per kilometre. Portugal is followed the Netherlands, Denmark and Greece, compared to the highest value in Estonia and Lithuania, with the UK also faring poorly, recording emissions almost 15 percent above those in Portugal.

The new study form the European Environment Agency's (EEA) European Topic Centre on Air pollution and Climate change Mitigation assessed the impact of taxes and incentives on purchases of new cars.

Average CO² emissions of new passenger cars in the EU has fallen steadily in recent years, from 170 g CO²/km in 2001 to 118 g CO²/km in 2016, with an

annual reduction rate of 2 percent. A further 19.5 percent reduction in average CO² emissions will be required to comply with the 2021 target of 95 g CO²/km (27 percent below the 2015 target).

There is substantial variation between countries, in terms of their average CO² emissions and the rate of reduction seen over time. Portugal had the lowest average CO² emissions of the EU-28 countries in 2016 of 105 g/km, followed by the Netherlands, Denmark and Greece, compared to the highest value of 134 g/km in Estonia, followed by Lithuania.

As regards EEA member countries, the average CO² emissions of new cars was the lowest in Norway (93 g/km) whilst the highest average CO² emissions were in Switzerland (134.0 g/km).

More doctors to be hired for Algarve

The government has authorised the hiring of four more family doctors for health units in Loulé, Silves, Lagoa and Tavira.

An additional doctor is also due to start work in Portimão next week. The Government authorised the opening of proceedings to fill the four vacancies in the Algarve, one in each of the aforementioned centres, as part of a national tender.

Novo Banco plans to close 73 branches this year

Portugal's Novo Banco bank plans to close 73 branches this year, bringing forward the target negotiated with Brussels, in addition to redundancies of 400 staff that had previously been announced.

nformation from the Workers' Commission to Novo Banco staff said it had met with the board of the bank, which said that "the targets to be reached by 2021 will be almost completely brought forward to the end of the first half of 2018", both in terms of staff redundancies and reducing branches. Novo Banco wants to cut over 400 employees this year, either through rescissions by mutual agreement or early retirement. The bank has

set aside €134 million for this process.

The bank's chief executive, António Ramalho, declined to disclose this information at the end of March, at the presentation of Novo Banco's results, saying that he wanted to inform the bodies representing the bank's workers before making this public information.

The information now released by the Workers' Commission details that 73 branches will close this year. At the end of 2017, Novo


Banco had 473 branches, so the goal is this year to reach the target agreed with Brussels to reduce the network to 400 branches. When these closures are complete, compared to the 631 branches that Novo Banco had at the end of 2014, the bank's network will be 40 percent smaller. As for the drop in staff, the period for staff to apply for terminations by mutual agreement ended on Friday, and there is still no information on how many have opted for voluntary

redundancy. This process is due to be decided in May. In terms of early retirement, the deadline for commercial network staff to apply has ended, and the period for the central service employees will now begin. Last October, Novo Banco (the bank that kept the

assets of the former BES bank, which was resolved on 3 August 2014) was 75 percent sold to US investment fund Lone Star with the Banking Resolution Fund (a State body financed by bank contributions) holding the remaining 25

Lone Star paid nothing in the deal, but agreed to inject €1 billion into Novo Banco, which it has already done. In 2017, Novo Banco posted a record loss of €1.395 billion, in a year in which it filed impairments (provisions for potential losses) of over €2 billion.

Rights of the Sole Trader



Currently there are approximately 800,000 | independent workers registered in Portugal. Being your own boss has its advantages. However, you need to pay careful attention since the contributions and tax payments are made by you, rather than by a company. In recent years, the self-employed have gained more and more rights. Nowadays, as occurs with salaried employees, these workers have achieved entitlement to protection in many situations, such as parenting, illness or unemployment. But to be eligible for these social benefits, you need to keep your Social Security contributions up-to-date. Note that if you have contributions in arrears, a grant will be suspended. The beneficiary regains the right to the support once the contributory situation has been rectified.

Maternity / Paternity Leave

Freelancers are entitled to a parental leave when they have children. This is an amount paid in cash to the parent at the time they are on leave for child birth and is intended to replace lost employment income. It may be granted either for 120 or 150 days, depending on parent's choice.

For example, if the mother decides to stay home with the baby for 120 days, she will receive 100% of the reference pay. If she chooses 150 days, she will

· Allowance for clinical risk during pregnancy If a pregnancy is at risk, the Freelancer is also entitled to a subsidy during pregnancy - support in situations where there is the existence of clinical risk, for mother or for the baby. To be eligible, a medical declaration is required, indicating the time considered necessary to avoid the risk. In these cases, the worker receives 100% of the reference wage

• Other support in parenting
Self-employed workers are also entitled to other forms of parental support from Social Security, such as the allowance for termination of pregnancy, an extended parental allowance, allowance for adoption and allowance for care or chronic illness. However, they do not qualify for a subsidy for child and grandchild assistance.

Right to sick pay

Self-employed workers are also entitled to illness benefits. There are some peculiarities. The initial payment of sick pay is subject to a waiting period of 30 days. The maximum period is one year. Note also that in the first month of illness, freelancers have to pay the respective contributions. When they return, they are also required to pay the contributions due on the number of days worked in the month.

Right to unemployment benefits

The right to unemployment benefits is one of the greatest achievements for independent workers in only access this provision, **GREENE** known as Activity Cessation Allowance, if you are considered economically dependent on a company, that is, if 80% of the total

amount of annual income comes from a single

Apart from this condition you must be registered in the Employment Centre. There must be an involuntary termination of the contract with the company and that you have been working for via green receipts over 720 days (two years) in the four years before termination.

Exemption from contributions

The self-employed are required to pay contributions for Social Security from the moment when they become part of the body of an organisation. However, in certain situations, they may be exempt from paying this levy. You may be entitled to exemption when accumulating independent activity to dependent work, when working for others puts the Freelancer into another social protection system, or if annual income is less than €5,146.80 [12 times IAS (€428.90)].

Beginning in 2019, a Sole Trader whose only income results from a Local Lodging activity will be exempt from Social Security contributions.

Right to an old-age pension

Those working on green receipts may also have access to a retirement pension. To be eligible for an old age pension, you must be aged 66 years and 4 months and have discounted for at least 15 years for Social Security. The amount you will receive depends on several factors, including your career earnings and how old you are when applying for retirement. Independent workers who retire early may continue to perform any activity without restrictions.

· Right to a disability pension

In the event of permanent incapacity for work, the self-employed are also entitled to protection from disability (relative or absolute). To receive this grant, you must have contributed to Social Security for at least 5 years in the case of "relative" disability, and at least 3 years in the event of "absolute" disability.

· Right to family protection in case of death On the death of the Freelancer, the family may be entitled to benefits, such as funeral allowance, reimbursement of funeral expenses, orphan's pension, widows, survival or death grant. To be eligible for death benefits, there is no minimum contribution period.

There will be landslides. This land borders the N124 where there are already warning signs of the danger of rock falls. How will places like Caldas de Monchique cope with this law and how will it look minus its trees and shrubs?

If we are all supposed to follow the law, why is there no action being taken to cut down the Eucalyptus that line part of the motorway into Lisbon from the direction of Sintra? Why wasn't this leaflet published last Autumn after last year's terrible fires,



Movement of Jack

The jack or 'kitty' as it is called in some parts of the world, is delivered and centred at the beginning of the game, and remains 'Live' solong as itremains

Pet SOS

Animal World

Most of us will have a first aid kit kicking around the house, to be used if there is ever an accident in the home, however it is equally important to have a first aid kit for your pet – especially if it has an already diagnosed condition which could make it susceptible to illness.



ut together a simple first aid kit for your pet and then keep it handy around the house or perhaps even in the car if you travel for walks. A pet first aid kit really only needs a few simple things such as bandages, bottled water and your vet's phone number which can come in very handy in the case of an emergency.



Cuts & Bites

One of the most common injuries for pets is a cut or a bite. When it comes to cuts the first thing to remember is to keep calm as often it can look a lot worse than it really is. If the wound is bleeding a lot then use bandages to put pressure on the area to stop the bleeding, just as you would with a human or instead clean the wound with some clean water and then cover it until you can get to the vet for further help. If your pet is bitten by

another animal then this can be very distressing for both you and the pet but again the key is not to panic. Many bites are puncture wounds that are not much to look at but bacteria from the teeth are often deposited deep in the bite and cause infections so keep calm and head to the vet for some treatment. Animals tend to put everything in their mouths from insects to plants. Wasp stings can often result in an allergic reaction causing swelling and this needs to be treated by a vet, usually with an anti-inflammatory injection. Some plants can be toxic. If your pet has eaten a poisonous plant it is useful to try and take a sample of the plant to your

Diabetic Pets

People with diabetic animals should always have some liquid glucose, honey or sugared water readily available just in case their pet's blood sugar level drops and they need to have sugar in an emergency to prevent the animal going into a coma. Eating the Wrong Thing First you need to be sure that your pet has eaten something it shouldn't have as you do not want to treat them on a hunch alone. If you are sure then bicarbonate crystals are useful as if force-fed straightaway; they will quickly make your pet vomit. You should then get your pet examined by a vet immediately. The above are guidelines, always seek the advice of a vet for pet treatment.

2. See the city from the water

The excellent value Copenhagen Card gives tourists free public transport by bus, train and Metro and free entry to 79 museums and attractions. Use it on a boat tour down the canals around what's known as the Harbour Circle, passing the colourful town houses of Nyhaven and enviably stylish house boats. towards the striking Black Diamond Library, Amalienborg Palace (the Danish royal family's official residency) and the famous Little Mermaid statue.

Inspired by Danish author Hans Christian Anderson's fairy-tale, the famous figure "has been decapitated twice and had her arm chopped off" in various protests, according to our tour guide. Price: DKK 80

3. Stay in a (nice) hostel

Gone are the days when hostel dorm rooms mean basic accommodation

The trend in Copenhagen right now is for swanky luxury hostels. The newly opened Steel House is a short walk from the central station and on the doorstep of one of the city's three adjoining lakes.

The former headquarters of the Danish Metalworkers' Union makes a fitting location for the New Yorkinspired, industrial-style

At Steel House, everything is stripped back; there's no desk, chair or wardrobe. Who really needs those on a weekend break? The four and six person dorm rooms are the smartest I've ever seen and each bed (sorry, pod) has some privacy, perfect for individual travellers or a group to book. The double rooms are very tight but functional, with everything you need and nothing you don't. The heart and soul of the hostel is the communal living area - which includes a large kitchen guests can cook in.

Price: Double rooms start at DKK 510 and beds in dorm rooms DKK 171, both include breakfast.

4. Hire city bikes The city is small enough to walk everywhere, but if you want to fit in with the Danes, you need to hop on a bike. There are thousands of Bycyklen - electric bikes with built in GPS to guide you - found at docking stations dotted around the city. Simply register online with a credit card to pay as you go before picking up a

Despite its notoriously expensive reputation, the Danish capital can be an affordable break, says Lauren Taylor.

And you'll be in good company; at the last count there were 265,700 bikes in Copenhagen. Strangely, no one appears to wear helmets (there's no requirement by law) but the roads are very bike friendly with cycle lanes and four bike-only highways. Price: Bike hire is DKK 30

per hour. 5. Share a Smorrebrod You can't go to Denmark without having an open sandwich - it's a Danish staple. Head to Din Nye Ven in Indre By, a laid-back and effortlessly cool cafe, for smorrebrod with toppings such as mackerel and smoked cream cheese or avocado piled high on rye bread, all traditionally washed down with Danish beer, like Pilsner or Mikkeller, and schnapps. The generous portions of good quality ingredients will keep you going for a busy day of sightseeing. Price: DKK 105 for two slices or DKK 300 for a

6. Take advantage of the fixed price trend Lots of the city's restaurants offer good deals if you book multicourse meals - so the more you eat, the better value you can expect. The trendy Norrebro district is known for it's gastronomic offerings and there's a

large sharing smorrebrod.



8. Become a kid again A trip to the Danish capital wouldn't be complete without stepping foot inside the Tivoli Gardens, which dates back to 1843. You don't find many amusement parks smack bang in the middle of a city, but the second oldest in the world, Tivoli, is a charming Danish institution. Here you'll find one of the world's oldest wooden roller-coasters,

Rutschebanen (which is faster than it looks) as well as The Demon, a more modern loop-the-loop. where riders wear a virtual reality headset. Don't miss out on lunch at new restaurant Gemyse in the gardens - where vegetables take centre stage, sustainability is a priority and you can eat in a greenhouse filled with growing herbs. The 'light meal' selection of green servings is DKK 175, while the more elaborate (and seriously delicious) six plate family-style sharing special is DKK 250 per person. Dishes change

Keep the mosquitos away – naturally

Living in a warm country has many benefits but one of the downsides to living in Portugal has to be mosquitoes – especially if you suffer with bad reactions.

hile there is no risk of Malaria in Portugal, being bitten by a mosquito is never an experience a person looks forward to, so if you want to reduce your chances of being bitten why not head to the garden for some natural solutions. Whether you have a large garden or only space for some window boxes, these plants have been shown to be effective in warding off mosquitos and are definitely worth a try!

Citronella - This is one of the most common ingredients in mosquito repellents so you may already be aware of citronella. This plant is a perennial clumping grass which gives off a strong smell that mosquitoes really don't like and a plant is usually much stronger than anything you can buy. Citronella can be grown in pots or in garden beds and is perhaps the top choice to ward off those pesky mosquitoes.

Lemon Balm - This plant is a member of the mint

family. The plant also known as horsemint and beebalm, is a very easy plant for beginning gardeners to grow. Lemon Balm is a very hardy plant, it resists drought, and it grows well even in shade. It is a very fast growing and sometimes aggressive plant, so you might want to contain it to a pot, where you can move it to wherever you like to ensure that it doesn't take over flower beds.

Marigolds - These bright and cheery annuals contain Pyrethrum, an ingredient used in many insect repellents. Bugs will hate the smell of marigolds but they are sure to bring colour and life to any border!

Lavender - Easy to grow, a fan of the climate and a mosquito repellent to boot - lavender has it all! Grow it indoors near a sunny window, or outside in your garden or flower bed to keep the bugs away. Garlic - It used to be thought that eating garlic would help to keep the mosquitoes away. However studies have shown that you would have to eat a huge amount for any small effects. While eating garlic may not help, growing it does, so start to grow some in your garden to keep the mosquitoes away and add another edible element to the TPN 📉 garden.

Shelf life - tips for putting up a shelf

There's something so pleasing about shelves. Such a simple, understated thing in the grand scheme of all things homes and interiors - but so useful, and so fun to look at.

losed cupboards and closets have their place, of course (we all need somewhere to stash unsightly clutter and shove stuff before guests come round), but shelves are made for keeping things on show. And that makes them an extension of your personal taste and style, and a means of ensuring things that bring you joy (or need to reach for often) are always visible. Styling up a shelf - perhaps with a draping plant, a handcrafted jug picked up on holiday and a treasured favourite photo - has got to be one of the simplest, and cheapest, ways to add character and a personalised touch to a room. And who doesn't love having a good nosy at other people's bookshelves? Whether we realise it or not, the contents and order (or chaos, as the case may be) of our shelves say a lot about who we are. Yes, shelves are practical, but their visual and curiosity-coaxing appeal goes so much further than that. So, we're in agreement: Shelves

are great. Thinking of attempting to put one up yourself? Here are a few pointers to help you get started...

Check your walls

Safety always comes first - so don't even think about drilling or hammering into a wall before you've checked it's safe to do so, and the wall is suitable. If you're unsure, the pros at B&Q suggest using a multi-purpose digital detector: "They're simple to use and will let you know if there are any pipes, cables or studs where you're planning to work - simply run it over the surface of the area and it will tell you where any hazards lie."

Test the strength

Make sure your shelf is going to be strong enough for what you intend to place on it - this isn't just about the shelf itself, but how it's fixed to the wall. You don't want something flimsy that's going to sag or, worse, fall off. B&Q says: "To see whether a new shelf might sag, try resting it on stacks of bricks or books,

spaced according to where the brackets will be set. Put the desired items on the shelf and then use a straightedge along it. If the shelf sags, bring the stacks closer together until it's completely straight. If the brackets can't be fixed that close together, you'll need to use a thicker material for the shelf."

Get the right materials and brackets

"There are a variety of shelving materials to suit different needs, from chipboard and MDF, to high-quality hardwoods like oak and beech. It's usually best to choose and space brackets according to the shelf material, its thickness, and the load the shelf will be supporting. Whether the brackets are fixed or part of an adjustable shelf system, these are always available in light, medium or heavyweight versions." If you're not sure, ask one of the DIY shop staff - they're there to help. Or buy a DIY shelf pack that contains everything you



Make sure it's straight

No really - please make sure it's properly straight before you start drilling and attaching. It might 'look' straight from where you're standing, but holding up a pencil, squinting or standing on the other side of the room never matches the accuracy of actually using a spirit level. You really don't want to do all the work and then realise your shelf is a little lopsided after all. If you don't have a spirit level, they're not too pricey.

Style it up!

Task complete - and it's straight? Big pat on the back for you. Now

for the really fun part, styling it up. Your shelf might already have a designated purpose in mind (mugs, jars or cookbooks in the kitchen; lotions and potions in the bathroom) but that doesn't mean you can't enjoy the process of getting it looking nice. And if its purpose is more to add to the style of a room, think about adding extra dimensions, colour and light (draping some fairy lights on a shelf works well in a bedroom or lounge), and a striking objet d'art on a high-up shelf is a great way to draw eyes upwards and elevate a space.

ushrooms are so rarely the star - unless you're vegetarian and faced, yet again, with mushroom risotto as your only option on a restaurant menu. However, chef Glynn Purnell is hoping to elevate the mushroom's humble profile to luxurious ingredient, having teamed up with Krug Champagne on From Forest To Fork, an expert mushroom and champagne pairing guide.

Charred aubergine with a Jerusalem artichoke veloute and winter mushrooms (Serves 6) 3 aubergines

300g chanterelles mushrooms (or mushrooms of your choice) 100g finely grated Parmesan 4 cooked chestnuts 500g Jerusalem artichokes 150ml milk 200ml double cream 2 shallots finely diced 25g unsalted butter 1 clove garlic finely chopped Rapeseed oil for frying and chargrilling Salt and pepper 1 lemon

1. Peel the Jerusalem artichokes, cut into cubes, and immediately put into a bowl of cold water with the juice of one lemon.

2. Heat a large saucepan

Being inventive with mushrooms

and then sweat the shallots with the butter. Add the artichoke, milk and cream, bring to the boil and simmer for 25 minutes. Remove from the heat and blend until smooth. Season the veloute to taste.

3. Slice the aubergine lengthways into eight even slices, discard the slice from each side which is mainly skin. Rub each slice with oil and chargrill until they are soft and pliable. Season each cooked slice with salt and pepper.
4. In a frying pan, with a little

oil, gently fry the mushrooms with the chopped garlic, as they start to soften, remove from the heat add a little salt and pepper and put aside.

5. Lay out the cooked aubergine slices on the bench and then divide up the cooked mushrooms evenly on each slice of aubergine, sprinkling about half of the grated Parmesan on each pile of mushrooms and then roll the aubergine into a fairly tight wrap.

6. Place the wraps on a lightly oiled baking tray, use the remaining cheese to sprinkle on the top of the wraps and put in a preheated oven 180C for four minutes to heat back through.

7. Reheat the veloute in a heavy based pan and put into a bowl, add the aubergine wraps and sprinkle the dish with crushed cooked chestnuts.

Fillet of beef with mushrooms (Serves 4)

1x hanger steak (about 500g-600g)
300g mixed mushrooms, chopped (foraged, or supermarket ones of your choice)
Knob of butter
A handful of parsely, chopped
1tbsp Marmite
300ml double cream
150g Montgomery cheddar
1tbsp dijon mustard

Salt and black pepper

1. Season the meat before searing for three to four minutes on each side over a mid-to-high heat - aim for a dark brown crust on the outside, with the meat still pink in the middle. Set aside to rest for around eight to 10 minutes.

2. Throw the butter, followed by the chopped mushrooms, into the same pan you cooked the beef in, sauteeing until soft.

3. Add the Marmite to the mushrooms, stirring through until thoroughly mixed in - a tablespoon of water can loosen the sauce if necessary. Just before they're ready, ad your chopped parsley and stir through.

4. Make the cheddar foam by heating the cream in a small pan over a medium heat, stir in the cheddar and mustard, season and whisk until smooth and frothy. Serve over the mushrooms, alongside the beef.



Buy the best quality
you can afford

"Apply a simple rule: quality over quantity. Do not go for anything less than fullgrain vegetable tanned leather, assembled using the saddle-stitching technique," advises Dani Caltik from Benny Bee Leather. "Hand stitching is essential in a bag to last a lifetime. When buying your next bag, remember to be sustainable, focusing on natural materials and high quality production. Pick one quality item over multiple disposable ones.

If you're buying direct from the maker, ask questions

"We, as makers, know all the ins and outs of using and making the most of our collections, so if you're not sure about any aspect or what to expect, it's best to be curious," says Grace Gordon. "Handbags really need to suit your lifestyle, and the right piece for one person might not work for another. Describe what you'd like to be able to use yours for, where you live, how you travel and how much time you're happy to spend on caring for your piece."

Choose your leather carefully

"Look for bags that are carefully handcrafted, as these bags will last the test of time and age beautifully. Choose a style that's comfortable to wear and fits all your daily essentials," insists Becky Cocker from CarvLondon


Embrace the ageing process of leather

Create a pollen-free home

From nuisance sneezing attacks to full-blown illness, hay fever can make life pretty miserable during pollen season - and if you're a sufferer, chances are you have a few tricks up your sleeve for when you head outdoors during spring and summer.

ut what about when you're indoors at home? Pollen sticks to just about everything (yep, that means clothes, shoes, hair, skin, pets) and gets carried in the air, so it's inevitable that some of the pesky particles will end up infiltrating your home too. Cue broken sleep, rotten evenings and starting the day with streaming eyes before you've even set foot outside.

So, what can you do to keep your house a pollenfree zone? While it may not be possible to banish it from your home entirely, these steps will certainly help...

1. Keep windows closed as much as possible

Pollen can waft indoors through open windows, so it's advisable to keep them closed as much as possible during pollen season. Naturally, nobody wants a stuffy house, and you may need to let some air through occasionally - but be savvy with your timings to minimise pollen infiltration. Allergy UK points out that keeping windows closed is especially "important in early mornings, when pollen is released, and in the evening when the air cools and pollens that have been carried up into the air begin to fall to ground level again". Keep an eve on daily pollen forecasts too,

so you can judge when it's best to let some air through.

2. Wash curtains and fabric covers

Despite your best efforts, there's still a good chance some pollen will get into your home - so it's a good idea to wash your curtains, along with any removable sofa or cushion covers. There's no set rule as to how often you should do this, but if your symptoms are flaring up while you're at home, a thorough top-totoe clean is probably in order!

3. Don't hang laundry to dry outdoors

Sure, being able to hang washing out to dry in the garden during spring and summer is superconvenient, but for hay fever sufferers, it's a no-no, as by the time it's dry, your laundry could be coated in pollen.

4. Invest in an air

So you're keeping the windows closed more than you'd ideally like and your laundry has to be dried indoors (not everything can go in the tumble-dryer, assuming you even have one of those) - it's not exactly a recipe for a nice, airy indoor environment, is it? Investing in a quality air purifier could be a good bet if your symptoms are troublesome.

5. De-pollen your pets before they come indoors

Got a dog or cat that spends time outdoors? Pollen can stick to their fur. this all over your house (and transferring it to your sofa, carpets and bedding), Allergy UK recommends wiping their coats with a damp microfibre cloth before they come in.

6. Up your vacuuming game

Being a bit more gung-ho with your vacuuming is a good idea during pollen season. And don't just do the floors; run the vacuumcleaner across soft furnishings, sofas, cushions, curtains and beds if required too.

7. Have an arrivinghome wash ritual

You might normally wait until right before bed to have a wash, but during pollen season, it's a good idea for hay fever sufferers to adopt a quick washing routine as soon as you get

so to prevent them traipsing

skin and hair, so a speedy shower will help prevent you 'sitting' with it for the rest of the evening, and transferring it to your sofa and bed. Keep your shoes and jacket by the front door, or shut away in a closed-off utility room or cloakroom if you have one too, as these

will bring pollen inside. 8. Avoid mowing the lawn

This might sound like a no-brainer, but if you've got hay fever, you probably want to avoid gardening particularly mowing the

lawn and raking leaves during pollen season. If you really can't put these tasks on hold, or rope in

somebody else to do them, then at least wear a filtration

Living with autism



Raising awareness for disability is what Accessible Portugal set up by the Portugal News and my blog at Marley and Mum is all about. Sometimes though it is important to remind people about the importance of raising awareness for disabilities which aren't so 'visible'.

espite the kindness and compassion I see from the differ entcommunities here in Portugal, this country is massively behind in terms of comprehension of mental disabilities and behavioural problems. My son Marley is on the spectrum caused by his genetic disorder and global delay. However mild though his behavioural tendencies are. this does not mean we have not had our fair share of discrimination. Staring, whispering and many comments related to his upbringing and whether I should just smack it out of him. Leading me safely to say this is an area of disability for which I am very passionate about raising awareness.

One of the biggest issues I see being neglected is autism, or autism spectrum disorder. This refers to a range of conditions characterised by challenges with social skills. renetitive behaviours, speech and nonverbal communication, as well as by unique strengths and differences. There are many types which are caused by different combinations of genetic and environmental influences. Not something sent to punish us or a lack of education... which is what I've also

heard here! The term 'spectrum' reflects the wide variation in challenges and strengths possessed by each person with autism.

Autism's most obvious signs tend to appear between two and three years of age. In some cases, it can be diagnosed as early as 18 months. A whopping one in 68 children are estimated to have autism. One third being non-verbal and another third having an intellectual disability. Certain medical and mental health issues frequently accompany autism. They include gastrointestinal (GI) disorders, seizures, sleep disturbances, attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), anxiety and phobias.

Most parents with a child on the autistic spectrum try and remain optimistic about their child's future. However, the lack of support and under $standing in Portugal \, can \, make$ them emotional and fraught. Speaking from experience. having a child with cognitive and behavioural limitations, it is very hard to remain hopeful of what the future holds with no system in place in regard to support. Which is what I hope to change over time.

How should WE behave? From my experience I want to

pass over some advice I have to parents of children with similar issues and also the general public so they can understand a bit better. Children on the autistic spectrum can often not appreciate physical contact. It's tactile defensiveness, not a lack of love that makes some kids on the spectrum resist hugs and kisses. Don't force yourself on anyone but certainly don't take offence with a child avoiding physical contact if they are on the spectrum. Often eye contact is also difficult so practicing communication can sometimes be helpful.

Children on the spectrum often really appreciate routine and don't welcome change. It's an important factor to bear in mind when entering the wide, wacky and wonderful world of autism. Some things you take for granted in the way you interact with people sometimes need to be changed. I found it hard changing my sense of sarcasm with Marley, for example, as it just gets completely lost along with figurative language.

With very little help and assistance here, which is what I want to focus on, it is important for families with children on the spectrum not to allow their unit to become isolated. Make sure you get out and enjoy other people's company and not care what people may think. Your expectations will change, for the better, It is so hard at first but you need to look at things in a positive light and embrace autism.

A mother's experience

Clare Rowe who used to be a resident in the Algarve, knows just how I feel. She says the biggest difficulty about life with son Riley is the negative attitudes of others. Her son has moderate-to-severe autism. and is largely non-verbal, but dealing with the realities of his condition are made so much harder when dealing with the unkindness she encounters from strangers, who decide for themselves that he is simply a 'badly behaved child with an inadequate mother.

'I have a 4-year-old boy with severe autism spectrum disorder commonly known as ASD with significant language delay. He will use vocalisations although not any spoken language as yet, he is classed as non-verbal. His understanding of spoken language is very limited and he has no awareness of danger around him, which causes daily challenges. He finds it hard just walking

down the road without running (bolting) to things he finds more interesting. This means he has to be strapped in his buggy at all times when we are out, to avoid this danger.'

Clare and her family ended up having to move back to the United Kingdom because of the lack of support she had here. It was simply impossible for them to continue living in Portugal, 'Since we have returned it's been nothing but positive. When we arrived back in England we had his health visitor two-year check where they referred him to audiology and when he failed his hearing test, he was referred to a community paediatrician for more investigation. On seeing the community paediatrician he expressed his concerns and told us he was autistic.' Just this is an enormous step taken, as in Portugal there is no way they would have a diagnosis even now. I know for a fact the hearing test machine in both Portimão and Faro hospital has been broken for over a year!

In the Algarve there are no specialist schools for preschool or primary school children with problems like Riley. Since moving back to the UK he has attended a specialist preschool which Clare describes as, 'the best thing ever, as they started teaching our son so differently but so much more effectively. The specialist pre-school uses a PECS (picture exchange communication system), visual support, visual timetables and Now and Next boards so Riley knew what was coming next at all times as autism is a prediction disorder. Now at four he has moved to a specialist school for a EHC (Education, Health and Care plan) through their local authorities and he is thriving. This is just unheard of in Portugal! In Portugal

I feel like this is where most families in Portugal's anxiety is based. No-one knows what will become of their children. What hope may they have with no decent support system in place? A lack of education of the general public massively effects Clare also, 'I would also say another very hard daily challenge is that our boy looks so neuro-typical or "normal". When he has meltdowns or sensory overloads, the general public can be very rude or uneducated as they think our children are just naughty when actually they are going through hell with loud noises, bright lights, strong smells. Keep strong our boy is making progress just a lot slower than children of his age group. Celebrate small steps.

There are so many families who are finding coping with the system implemented here very difficult. Gemma da Silva is one of them, whose son Zac has high-functioning autism. To most people he looks completely normal and Gemma has had a very difficult time trying to implement a support system for him. At present Zac is refusing school and the school are trying to ease him back in gently, but this means being placed in a class with children with severe developmental delays whereas Zachas an incredible cognitive ability. This unfortunately doesn't help in encouraging him back into school.

Gemma has had a very difficult time getting under-standing within the school setting and it has taken years to get him 'sinalizado', the equivalent to SEN in the UK. Meanwhile she was told he needed stronger discipline such as smacking and her parenting was the cause of the problem. Often his meltdowns are a response to people not knowing best how to handle a child with autism, for example, you do not restrain them if they are in fight or flight mode' Strategies could easily be implemented with better training for educational professionals to enable them to adapt to autistic children.

Gemma would like to see different syllabuses where learning is lead-based on what the children's interests are so they can tap into that. Gemma goes on to say, 'I would like there to be more acceptance of homeschooling when school is having such a negative psychological effect on

children and there needs to be an alternative form for children who don't function in a normal state school. Autistic or not.'

Currently I am going through a very time-consuming process with my son Marley as he gets back on his feet. Spending so much time in hospital though has made me have a lot of time on my hands to think about how we as a community can help families in need in the Algarve with children with disability that might not be so visible. I am working hard makina connections to see if there is something that can be done in the future and it is my dream to be able to open a centre to benefit my son and all the other children with disability in the Algarve. Watch this space...

I wish I could tell other parents that may be reading this article that I have the answers they need. But I don't even have the answers for my own journey. Our children will continue to grow and change and will surprise us by doing things we neverthought possible. So we must remain hopeful and also be proactive in creating as many opportunities as we can. Success won't necessarily be measured by academic performance or job placements so fill your life with the small pleasures. Let's work together to make life betterfor each other as after all our future should look like the best parts

Benfica suffered their first home Primeira Liga defeat of the season as FC Porto returned to the top of the pile with a ninetieth minute goal at the Estádio da Luz on Sunday evening. Third place Sporting, they play Benfica on 5 May, came out victors in a seven goal thriller at Belenenses, who ended the game with nine men.

wenty-five top European clubs from England, France, Germany, Italy and Spain had scouts at the top-of-the-table clash.

Eleven English Premier League clubs including Manchester City, Liverpool, Manchester United,

Arsenal, Everton and Spurs were represented at the game as they looked to identify the latest hot talent. In the last eight years, Benfica alone have sold fourteen of their most sought-after players for over €340m. Right up to kick-off Benfica and Porto had concerns over the fitness of

their main strikers, Jonas' absence opened up the opportunity for Raúl Jiménez to prolong his recent patch of good form at the pinnacle of Benfica's attack, meanwhile Moussa Marega returned to the starting line-up for FC Porto. During the first-half the best use of possession

remained with the home the interval

side but both teams squandered chances as Pizzi, one-on-one with the goalkeeper, failed to guide a close-range volley past FC Porto keeper Casillas, whilst at the other end Marega steered Ricardo's cross wide a minute before to open up. Brahimi edged the Dragons closer to the opener in the sixty-sixth minute as he curled a shot just wide of the target. With the two sides staring at a goalless draw, Héctor Herrera was able to stun the home fans with a ferocious strike from the edge of the box to place Porto in front in the final minute of normal time, leaving Benfica just four minutes to conjure up a response. The added time was enough to squeeze in a

penalty shout on Andrija Zivkovic, floored in a collision with Ricardo prior to the referee's snub, as Sérgio Conceição's men held on to secure a valuable victory over their rivals. FC Porto, now two points clear at the top with four games to play, face a difficult trip to Madeira on 29 April to play Marítimo. In the past five seasons they have failed to secure a Primeira Liga victory on the

island having drawn three and lost twice. Sporting were involved in a feisty encounter with Lisbon rivals Belenenses. The home side took the lead after eight minutes through their Algerian international Hassan Yebda.

Bas Dost netted his twentyfifth goal of the season for Sporting five minutes later and Gelson Martins edged the Lions in front in the sixteenth minute. Acuña made it 3-1 just before the interval.

Belenenses hit back midway through the second-half as Lica and Fredy levelled the score before Hassan Yebda received his marching orders after picking up a second vellow card. Four minutes later Bruno Fernandes slotted home the winning goal for Sporting which leaves them just three points behind arch-rivals Benfica and that all important game between the two teams at the Alvalade in early May.

Portugal to face Scotland in football friendly

Scotland will host Portugal in a friendly match at Hampden Park on 14 October, the Scottish Football Association has announced.

Real Madrid's Cristiano Ronaldo, Manchester City's Bernardo Silva and AC Milan's Andre Silva will be expected to be in the reigning European Champions' squad for the trip to Glasgow.

The match will take place three days after Scotland's fixture away to Israel in the UEFA Nations League, with the kick-off time still to be confirmed.

Scotland boss Alex McLeish told the SFA's website: "Portugal will provide a stern test for our players, which is exactly what we are looking for in our opposition in challenge matches.

"The recent challenge matches against Costa Rica and Hungary were invaluable to myself and my coaching team, allowing us to get to know the players and

experiment with different systems and this match will provide further opportunity for the team to develop.

"Our Nations League campaign will be in full swing when we play Portugal and it can only be a huge incentive to the players to have the opportunity to test themselves against some of the best in the world."

The confirmation of Portugal's visit completes Scotland's fixtures for this year.

Scotland were drawn in a three-team group in UEFA Nations League Group C, resulting in two free international fixture dates that have now been filled by Belgium and Portugal.

Scotland last played the Portuguese in a friendly match in Braga in 2002, with the visitors winning 2-0 with a Pauleta double.
